Mr. Chair:

Your Committee on Budget, which considered Bill 60 (2010) entitled:

“A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO FEES AND CHARGES FOR USE
OF PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITIES,”

transmitted by Communication D-850 (2010), from the Department of Parks and
Recreation, and which passed first reading at the December 8, 2010 Council meeting,
reports as follows:

The purpose of the Bill is to establish camping fees for the use of parks and
recreation facilities.

Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) Deputy Director Richard Haru
testified that the Bill was introduced to provide equity in the way camping permits were
being applied for, cut down on abuse of individuals pulling multiple camping permits and
to establish an on-line camping permit system. The fees collected would help the
department recoup some of the costs of maintaining camping areas and are not a
revenue generating measure. DPR anticipates the fees collected could total \$350,000
or 15.5% of the total cost of operating and maintaining the 170 individual and 8 group
camping sites.


Committee Meeting Held

1. In Section 2, the paragraph numbers are underlined to conform the section to proper ramseyer formatting.
2. For permits for a site with less than 10 people, the minimum number of days is changed from 5 to 3.
3. Corrected language regarding the effect of the underscoring is added to section 3.

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE

RELATING TO FEES AND CHARGES FOR USE OF PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITIES.

BE IT ORDAINED by the People of the City and County of Honolulu:

SECTION 1. Purpose and intent. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish camping fees.


SECTION 2. Chapter 10, Article 2, Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated by the revisor of ordinances and to read as follows:

"Sec. 10-2. Fees for Camping.

The following fees shall be assessed for use of campsites:

- (1) \$12.50 per day with a 3-day minimum starting Friday through Tuesday for campsites holding up to 10 people.
- (2) \$75.00 per day with a 3-day minimum for campsites holding up to 60 people.
- (3) \$125.00 per day with a 3-day minimum for campsites holding up to 100 people.
- (4) \$312.50 per day with a 3-day minimum for campsites holding up to 250 people."

SECTION 3. New material is underscored. When revising, compiling or printing this ordinance for inclusion in the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu, the revisor of ordinances need not include the underscoring.
