Mr. Chair:

Your Committee on Budget, which considered Bill 30 (2011) entitled:

“A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PARKING FEES AT CITY
PARKS,”

which passed first reading at the March 16, 2011 Council meeting, reports as follows:

The purpose of the Bill is to assess parking fees for parking at certain City parks.

The Committee heard testimony in support of the Bill from the Department of Parks and Recreation and from a representative of Makai Parking Management. The Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation also noted that they will be communicating with the Diamond Head/Kapahulu/St. Louis Heights Neighborhood Board regarding the expansion of parking fees at Kapiolani Regional Park.

Your Committee amended the Bill as follows: 1) specifies that subsection (g)(2)(B) applies to Kapiolani Regional Park and Aala Park; 2) establishes that for parking meters covered by subsections (g)(2)(B) and (g)(2)(C), the rates are in effect 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and that the rate is \$1.00 per hour; and 3) establishes that the department may charge \$1.00 per day for designated parking stalls for special events in parks.



A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE

RELATING TO PARKING FEES AT CITY PARKS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the People of the City and County of Honolulu:

SECTION 1. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to assess parking fees for parking at certain City parks.

SECTION 2. Section 10-1.2, Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990 ("Park rules and regulations"), is amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:

"(g) (1) Within the limits of any public park, it is unlawful for any person, where signs are posted prohibiting or restricting such activities, to operate, park or stand a motor vehicle in violation of such prohibitions or restrictions. Such signs may impose any prohibition or restriction upon the operation, parking or standing of motor vehicles which the director of parks and recreation shall determine will maximize the enjoyment and use of any park by park users. Such restrictions may include the installation of parking meters in parks. As used in this subsection, "parking meter" means the same as defined in Section 15-2.16.

(2) Parking Meter Charges and Time Limits.

(A) Meters at the Honolulu Zoo parking lot shall have a four-hour time limit at the rate of \$1.00 per hour.

(B) Meters [on the mauka side of Kalakaua Avenue between Monsarrat Avenue and the Paki Avenue-Poni Moi Road-Diamond Head Road intersection] in Kapiolani Regional Park and Aala Park shall have a [four-hour time limit at the] rate of [50 cents] \$1.00 per hour and shall be in effect [between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.,] 24 hours per day, seven days a week.

(C) Whenever the City installs parking meters at City parks other than those specified in this subdivision, the meters shall have a rate of \$1.00 per hour and shall be in effect 24 hours per day, seven days a week.

(3) The department may issue a permit or permits to allow for reserved parking in designated parking stalls in parks during special events held in the park, such as concerts, athletic events, or festivals. The department

shall charge a fee of \$1.00 per day per parking stall reserved for such permits. This fee is separate from parking meter charges.

[(3)](4) Parking Meter Violations.

- (A) No person shall violate any provision of Section 15-22.11.
- (B) Every hour a vehicle remains parked, stopped, or standing in violation of any provision of Section 15-22.11 shall constitute a separate violation."

SECTION 3. Section 15-16.3, Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990 ("Parking within public parks and public school grounds restricted"), is amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:

"(e) Wherever any roadway or parking area within public parks and public school grounds is kept open for vehicular use, no person shall park a vehicle on any such roadway or in any such parking area for a period of time longer than 60 minutes between the hours of two a.m. and six a.m. of any day except as provided in Section 10-1.2(g)."

SECTION 4. Ordinance material to be repealed is bracketed. New material is underscored. When revising, compiling or printing this ordinance for inclusion in the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu, the revisor of ordinances need not include the brackets, the bracketed material or the underscoring.
