



RESOLUTION

URGING THE CITY ADMINISTRATION TO CONDUCT A THREE-YEAR PILOT PROGRAM ALLOWING COMMERCIAL ACTIVITY AT CERTAIN CITY PARKS.

WHEREAS, parks along the Waianae Coast have very few beach concessions; and

WHEREAS, allowing commercial activity at certain parks along the Waianae Coast would expand the availability of food and goods available to beachgoers and also stimulate the economy; and

WHEREAS, the Nanakuli Neighborhood Board ("Board") has requested that a pilot program be established to allow vendors to sell handcrafted, homemade, and food items at city parks in the area, such as Tracks Beach Park and Kahe Point Beach Park, provided that all such vendors be licensed and present their license to the Board; and

WHEREAS, each park could have a designated area for licensed vendors to set up tables and kiosks to sell goods during the park hours from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m.; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City and County of Honolulu that the city administration is urged to conduct a three-year pilot program ("program") allowing commercial activity in certain city parks; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Parks and Recreation is requested to propose any legislation and amend their rules and regulations as needed to allow for the implementation of this program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all police reports associated with the program be shared with the Board; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that at the end of the three-year program, the department is requested to report to the Council on the outcome of the program; and



RESOLUTION

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor, the Managing Director, and the Director of Parks and Recreation.
