



## RESOLUTION

---

SUPPORTING CREATION OF A STATE LAW ENFORCEMENT MEMORIAL IN THE HAWAII CAPITOL DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the Hawaii State Legislature adopted House Concurrent Resolution 139 (2010) on April 23, 2010, which requested the Department of Accounting and General Services to work with the Hawaii Law Enforcement Memorial Foundation, the county police departments, the Department of Public Safety, the United States Marshal for the district of Hawaii, the State of Hawaii Organization of Police Officers, and the Concerns of Police Survivors Incorporated, to plan and construct a Hawaii state law enforcement memorial; and

WHEREAS, according to the Hawaii Law Enforcement Memorial Foundation the response to House Concurrent Resolution 139 (2010) resulted in preliminary site identification for the memorial, a partnership with the University of Hawaii at Manoa, School of Architecture for a design of the memorial, and initial fundraising of private funds to build the memorial; and

WHEREAS, the 2011 Legislature passed House Bill 1622, House Draft 1, signed it into law as Act 14 (2011), which directed that a state law enforcement memorial be constructed in the Capitol District, preferably on the Diamond Head side of the Kalanimoku building, provided that private funds be used to do so; and

WHEREAS, a ceremonial ground breaking for the memorial was held on May 16, 2011, and included representatives from all major law enforcement agencies operating in the state, including the Honolulu Police Department; and

WHEREAS, according to the Hawaii Law Enforcement Memorial Foundation, over fifty Hawaii law enforcement officers have lost their lives in the line of duty; and

WHEREAS, the construction of a Hawaii State Law Enforcement Memorial will honor these fallen officers whose lives were lost in service to the people of Hawaii; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City and County of Honolulu that it supports the creation of a Hawaii State Law Enforcement Memorial in the Hawaii Capitol District, as directed by Act 14; and




