

In commemoration of the 110th anniversary of Korean Immigration to the United States of America in 2013, Inha University, Incheon, Republic of Korea, desires to gift a sculpture grouping of three polished stones created by sculptor Soo Park and calligrapher In-ku Yoon. This work of art was created to promote active exchanges and cooperation between the sister cities of Incheon Metropolitan City and the City and County of Honolulu.

RESOLUTION

RELATING TO THE ACCEPTANCE OF A GIFT OF ARTWORK FROM INHA UNIVERSITY, INCHEON, REPUBLIC OF KOREA, TO THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU FOR THE ART IN CITY BUILDINGS COLLECTION

WHEREAS, Incheon Metropolitan City, Republic of Korea, has a sister-city relationship with the City and County of Honolulu; and

WHEREAS, the year 2013 will mark the 110th Anniversary of Korean Immigration to the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, Inha University was founded in 1954 in Incheon Metropolitan City, Republic of Korea with the generous donations from Hawaii residents of Korean ancestry who were aspiring to rebuild their native country; and

WHEREAS, Inha University, Incheon, Republic of Korea, desires to gift a sculpture grouping of three polished stones entitled "Monument to the 110th Anniversary of Korean immigration to the USA" by sculptor Soo Park and calligrapher In-Ku Yoon; and

WHEREAS, the sculpture's three stones ranging in size from 20 inches to 79 inches high, symbolize: 1) the year 1903 and the first Korean immigrants; 2) the lives of the immigrants depicted with footprints; and 3) everlasting truth depicted with the Chinese character "Jin"; and

WHEREAS, this work of art was created to promote active exchanges and cooperation between sister-cities, Incheon Metropolitan City and the City and County of Honolulu; and

WHEREAS, at their meeting of September 20, 2012, the Commission of Culture and the Arts adopted a motion to request the acceptance of this gift by the Council; and

WHEREAS, Section 13-113 of the Revised Charter of the City and County of Honolulu provides for the acceptance of gifts to the City by the Council of the City and County of Honolulu; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 05-349, CD1, FD1, sets forth the policy of the Council for the solicitation, receipt, and acceptance of gifts by the Council on behalf of the City; and



RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the policy provides that an executive agency may request the Council's immediate consideration of a request for acceptance of a gift to the City to allow the agency's time-sensitive expenditure of the gift; and

WHEREAS, through a letter dated September 28, 2012, the Office of Economic Development has submitted a request to the Council for acceptance of the gift of a sculpture from the Inha University, Incheon, Republic of Korea; and

WHEREAS, the description, value and terms of conveyance of the gift are set forth in the Declaration of the Gift, attached hereto as Exhibit A; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City and County of Honolulu that this body accept the gift valued at \$60,000 from the Inha University, Incheon, Republic of Korea; and

The three stones, ranging in size from 20 inches high to 79 inches high symbolize: the year 1903 and the first Korean immigrants; lives of the immigrants depicted with footprints; and everlasting truth depicted with the Chinese character "jin."
