**RESOLUTION**

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**AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF APPLICATIONS AND THE EXECUTION OF GRANT OR COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS WITH THE FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION FOR FEDERAL TRANSPORTATION ASSISTANCE AUTHORIZED BY 49 U.S.C. CHAPTER 53, TITLE 23, UNITED STATES CODE, AND OTHER FEDERAL STATUTES ADMINISTERED BY THE FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION (FTA), FOR GRANT APPLICATION HI-90-X034.**

WHEREAS, Chapter 1, Article 8, Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990, as amended, requires that any intergovernmental agreement or any amendments thereto which place an obligation upon the City or any department or agency thereof shall require prior City Council consent and approval; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 1, Article 8, Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990, as amended, also requires that, when carrying out the provisions of any intergovernmental agreement, all applications and/or other official communications which support the application and which are required to be provided by the City or its component departments to any other governmental or quasi-governmental agency shall first be presented to the City Council for its review and approval prior to their transmittal; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) is an operating administration of the United States Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the FTA has been delegated authority to award Federal financial assistance for transportation and public transit projects; and

WHEREAS, the grant or cooperative agreement for Federal financial assistance will impose certain obligations upon the City, and may require the City to provide the local share of project costs; now, therefore

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City and County of Honolulu that the Director, Department of Transportation Services (DTS Director), or the Director's designee, is authorized to execute and file applications on behalf of the City and County of Honolulu with the FTA for Federal assistance authorized by 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53, Title 23, United States Code and other Federal statutes administered by the FTA, for grant application HI-90-X034. The application filed with the FTA shall be consistent with the draft application attached hereto and by reference made a part of this Resolution; and

2. That the Corporation Counsel or the Corporation Counsel's designee is authorized to execute other documents the FTA may require before awarding a Federal assistance grant or cooperative agreement, so long as such documents do not incur additional obligations on the part of the City;
3. That the DTS Director or the Director's designee is authorized to furnish such additional information as the FTA may require before awarding a Federal assistance grant or cooperative agreement;
4. That the DTS Director or the Director's designee is authorized to execute grant or cooperative agreements with the FTA on behalf of the City and County of Honolulu; and
5. That the Mayor or the Mayor's designee is authorized to receive and utilize funds from the FTA on behalf of the City and County of Honolulu; and

1b. JARC. (STIP OC13, OC18, & OC16):

In April 2009, the City and County of Honolulu, through its Department of Transportation Services (DTS), completed a planning and extensive public outreach process that resulted in a "Human Services Transportation Coordination Plan" (Plan). The Plan was updated in 2012 and identifies transportation gaps on Oahu for people with disabilities, seniors and people with low incomes, and provides a prioritized list of projects that meet strategic goals and objectives. The projects in this grant application were drawn from the adopted Plan and were developed through a competitive selection process that was separate from, but coordinated with, the planning process. The projects will improve transportation options for persons with low incomes through improved coordination of all publicly funded transportation on the island of Oahu.

Specifically, the funds requested in this grant application will provide for selected human service agencies to provide transportation for their own clients, for mobility management programs to provide a variety of services and functions that facilitate transportation coordination, and for a local shuttle service.

a. Agency-Provided Trips (STIP #OC13)

FTIP Consistency: Project ID: OC13 (see attachment in TEAM)

This project ranked as a top priority for the goal of improving TheHandi-Van timeliness and trip length. Honolulu's 2009 FTA Triennial Review includes a finding that "[TheHandi-Van trip] denials are an ongoing problem and the supply of service does not meet the demand for service." A key factor contributing to trip denials is the number of subscription trips during morning and evening peak travel hours, which exceeds the 50 percent maximum allowed by 49 CFR Part 37. This project will reduce TheHandi-Van's peak hour subscription demand by providing operating assistance to selected human service agencies as transportation providers serving clients who are presently carried by TheHandi-Van. The majority of these riders qualify as low-income and will use the transportation for employment-related purposes such as job training. Significant service improvements to the TheHandi-Van may eventually be realized as the program reaches sufficient size.

The JARC funds will provide transportation for clients of the subrecipient (Goodwill)'s Adult Day Health (ADH) Medicaid Waiver program. The ADH program provides group supports in self-advocacy and self-sufficiency skills for people with developmental disabilities. The Hawaii Department of Human Services (DHS) administers the Medicaid Home and Community-based Services (H&CBS) program, and the Hawaii Department of Health's Developmental Disabilities Division (DOH-DDD) operates and authorizes services for people with developmental disabilities. The main purpose of the ADH program is to develop and implement creative alternatives to placing people with developmental disabilities in an employment setting or in the community instead of hospitals or facilities. The program also focuses on vocational and job skills training, opportunities for meaningful participation in the community, the development of associations with community members, discovering ways to contribute, and establishing roles of leadership and partnerships in one's community.

The ADH program meets their clients' vocational and job skills training outcomes through partnerships with other non-profit agencies to gain real life job experience completing volunteer work, and through person-centered goals that are established at the participants' Individual Service meeting. These goals range from basic typing skills to simple food preparation classes.

The subrecipient completes quarterly quality assurance checks and summarizes these reports annually to ensure that the program is meeting the vocational training needs and goals established for its participants.

The Department of Transportation Services will be responsible for ensuring that the required local match will be made available for the project by its funding partners. Subrecipient's match will be provided from their general funds.

b. Mobility Management (STIP #OC18; ALI 11.7L.00)  
FTIP Consistency: Project ID: OC18 (see attachment in TEAM)

Mobility Management is the Plan's top priority for the goal of reducing duplication of services and increasing efficiencies through coordination. The mobility management program will provide a variety of services and functions to facilitate transportation coordination. The primary objective of mobility management is to improve access to transportation for people with disabilities, seniors, and people with low incomes by coordinating transit and human service transportation in the City and County of Honolulu. The tasks and responsibilities of the mobility management program include:

- Identifying and obtaining grant funding;
- Grant writing, management, and reporting
- Interagency coordination- identifying agency partners capable of serving needs identified in the community and developing agreements for services to meet these needs;
- Transportation information and referral services;
- Planning and managing projects that demonstrate coordinated transportation services;
- Coordination project performance monitoring;
- Managing transportation service agreements, contracts and oversight of coordination projects;
- Providing travel training for individuals with developmental and cognitive disabilities, and for adults 60 years old and older; and
- Facilitating oversight committee meetings

Federal assistance for the mobility management program will be provided through a combination of grants:

\$176,138 — Application HI-37-X009 (FFY2012 Section 5316 Urban Area Funds- pending)  
\$440,662 — This application (Section 5307 Urban Area Funds\*)  
\$616,800 Total Federal Participation

200,000 population will be transferred to the Section 5307 apportionment for Kailua (Honolulu, HI)-Kaneohe UZA #153480.)

The 20% local matching share will be provided by the Department of Transportation Services through its operating budget.

c. Local Shuttle Service (STIP #C16)  
FTIP Consistency: Project ID: C16 (see attachment in TEAM)

This project was identified as the second priority in the development of the City's Coordinated Human Services Transportation Plan.

This project will maintain operation of a current shuttle service between the Kalaeloa homeless shelter sites and the Kapolei Transit Center in Leeward Oahu to connect low-income residents with employment-related transportation. People living in other areas on the island will also benefit from improved access to job opportunities in the Leeward Oahu area.
