1. **[RESOLUTION 15-207](#) – ACCEPTANCE OF GIFT.** Relating to the acceptance of a gift from the Waikiki Business Improvement District Association, valued at \$100,000, to address various illegal activities on the public sidewalks in specific areas in Waikiki and to upgrade the existing security camera system along Kalakaua Avenue. (Transmitted by Communication [D-538](#))
2. **[RESOLUTION 15-213](#) – ACCEPTANCE OF GIFT.** Relating to the acceptance of gift to the City from the Honolulu Firefighters Foundation, valued at \$21,207.22 for various Honolulu Fire Department projects and events. (Transmitted by Communication [MM-105](#))
3. **[RESOLUTION 15-224](#) – ACCEPTANCE OF GIFT.** Relating to the acceptance of a gift to the City from the Friends of the Missing Child Center - Hawaii, valued at \$5,500 for the Honolulu Police Department's Specialized Services Division Canine Unit. (Transmitted by Communication [D-584](#))
4. **[RESOLUTION 15-225](#) – ACCEPTANCE OF GIFT.** Relating to the acceptance of a gift to the City from Kick Start Karate, valued at \$1,200 for six members of the Honolulu Police Department to attend the 13th Annual Taste Of Kick Start fund-raiser on September 6, 2015. (Transmitted by Communication [D-587](#))
5. **[RESOLUTION 15-226](#) – ACCEPTANCE OF GIFT.** Relating to the acceptance of a gift to the City from SolarCity Corporation, valued at \$25,000 for a photovoltaic system for familiarization and refresher training. (Transmitted by Communication [D-588](#))

6. **BILL 56 (2015) – STATE FIRE CODE.** Adopting the State Fire Code as adopted by the State of Hawaii (State) on August 15, 2014, subject to certain amendments which shall apply to the City. (Transmitted by Communication D-539) (Bill passed first reading on 8/5/15)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 56 (2015) (Submitted by Councilmember Anderson) – The proposed CD1 (OCS/2015-0713/8/5/2015 9:46 AM) makes the following amendments:

- A. Adds a proposed new item (9) adding an exception to Section 10.14.1 to read:
- In the assembly occupancy, natural cut Christmas trees shall be permitted, provided such trees shall be treated and maintained in a flame-retardant condition by means of a flame-retardant solution or process approved by the AHJ, provided further that such trees shall be treated and maintained as provided in Section 10.14.9.
- B. Adds a proposed new item (10) amending the assembly occupancy row of Table 10.14.1.1.
- C. Renumbers the items following proposed new item (10).
- D. Makes non-substantive technical amendments to the bill with respect to drafting style and formatting, 2012 NFPA 1 Fire Code references, and other technical amendments.

7. **BILL 51 (2015) – RELATING TO BIRDS.** Regulating the raising of birds to protect public health, welfare, safety, peace and enjoyment of property in residential neighborhoods. (Bill passed first reading 7/8/15; deferred in Committee 7/21/15)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 51 (2015) (Submitted by Councilmember Fukunaga) – The CD1 (OCS2015-0761/8/10/2015 3:41 PM)) makes the following amendments:

- A. Removes the amendments made to the Animal Nuisance Law in ROH Chapter 7, Article 2.
- B. Amends the definition of "public nuisance" in the Housing Code (ROH Section 27-2.1) to include the following:
- (17) An accumulation of birds producing loud calls that exceed 45 decibels during nighttime hours or 55 decibels during daytime hours."

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- C. Amends the judicial enforcement section of the Housing Code (ROH Section 27-10.5(d)) to allow corporation counsel to seek an injunction if more than twenty-five public nuisance complaints are received within a one-year period.
- D. Makes technical and non-substantive changes for purposes of style and clarity.
