MINUTES OF THE SEPTEMBER 17, 2015 REGULAR MEETING

**FOR ACTION**

1. **BILL 70 (2015) – RELATING TO TAXICABS.** Promoting the increased safety of taxicab and passengers and drivers. (Bill 70 (2015) passed first reading on 10/7/15)
  
2. **BILL 52 (2015) – RESTRICTED PARKING ZONES (RPZ).** Establishing an RPZ program to help ease parking congestion in residential neighborhoods surrounded by major traffic generators like hospitals and universities, while balancing the needs of all people to use the public streets. [Bill 52 (2015) passed second reading and public hearing held on 8/5/15]

**PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 52 (2015)** – (Submitted by Councilmember Fukunaga)  
– The CD1 (OCS2015-0957/10/1/2015 9:20 AM) makes the following amendments:

1. Amends bill to establish a pilot restricted parking zone program.
2. Amends bill to an uncodified ordinance.
3. Amends Section 2 (former Sec. 15-\_\_\_.1) to remove the definition of “Employee.”
4. Amends Section 3(b) (4) (former Sec. 15-\_\_\_.2(b)(4)) to read as follows:  
  
If issued to a resident, a permit must be used within \_\_ contiguous city blocks of the dwelling unit address.
5. Amends Section 3(c) (former Sec. 15-\_\_\_.2(c) to read as follows:  
  
Application: In order to obtain an RPZ permit, an applicant must present proof of residency in or adjacent to the restricted parking zone boundary, in addition to submittal of a complete application to the director. An applicant must also present proof that the address of vehicle registration matches the applicant’s dwelling unit address or that the applicant is an out of state non-resident or active military personnel.
6. Amends Section 3 (former Sec. 15-\_\_\_.2) to remove subsections (e) through (i).

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7. Removes former Sec. 15-\_\_\_.3 (“Employee permits”).
8. Amends Section 4(a)(3) (former Sec. 15-\_\_\_.4(a) (3)) to read as follows:  
  
Regardless of potential benefits or adverse impacts that may result, the director will not install pilot restricted parking zones in any area in which residents have not requested the establishment of such a pilot program.
9. Amends Section 4(d) (former Sec. 15- \_\_\_.4(e)) to read as follows:  
  
Prior to the director’s decision to establish, not to establish, or to dissolve, a pilot restricted parking zone or to expand or reduce a pilot RPZ by more than two contiguous blocks, the director may hold a public meeting at which the director provides interested persons an opportunity to submit written and oral comment into the public record.
10. Amends Section 4 (former Sec. 15-\_\_\_.4) to remove subsections (f) through (l) and subsection (n). Re-designates the remaining subsections accordingly.
11. Renumbers former Sec. 15-\_\_\_.5 as Section 5.
12. Amends Section 5(b)(1) (former Sec. 15-.5 (b)(1)) to read as follows:  
  
The waiver or reduction is in the overall public interest due to extraordinary facts or circumstance; or
13. Amends Section 5(b)(2) (former Sec. 15\_\_\_.5(b)(2)) to read as follows:  
  
The waiver or reduction is consistent with the goals of the pilot restricted parking zone program.
14. Removes Section 5(b)(3) (former Sec. 15-\_\_\_.5(b)(3)).
15. Adds Sections 6 and 7.
16. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
