



## RESOLUTION

---

RENAMING NANAKULI BEACH PARK TO KALANIANAOLE BEACH PARK.

WHEREAS, Section 22-9.5(e), Revised Ordinances of Honolulu ("ROH"), requires the Council to approve all naming or renaming of City parks, sites or facilities or any portion thereof by resolution; and

WHEREAS, Section 22-9.5(f), ROH, allows the Council to initiate the designation of a name for a new or existing park, site, facility or any portion thereof, or memorial by resolution; and

WHEREAS, Section 22-9.3(a)(3), ROH, outlines certain eligibility criteria that must be met when a new or existing park, site facility or any portion thereof is proposed to be named for a deceased individual; and

WHEREAS, on February 27, 1940, the Honolulu Board of Supervisors (now known as the Honolulu City Council) and the Mayor approved Resolution 54 which designated the use of the name Kalanianaole Park for a stretch of land now officially named Nanakuli Beach Park; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 54 was intended to honor the memory and legacy of Prince Jonah Kuhio Kalanianaole, whose accomplishments include reorganizing the Royal Order of Kamehameha in 1903, founding the first Hawaiian Civic Club in 1918, introducing the first Hawaii Statehood Act of 1919 as an elected Congressional delegate, and serving on the first Hawaiian Homes Commission in 1921; and

WHEREAS, at its September 15, 2009 meeting, the Nanakuli-Mailii Neighborhood Board No. 36 passed a motion by a majority vote in support of renaming Nanakuli Beach Park to Kalanianaole Beach Park; and

WHEREAS, at its August 18, 2015 meeting, the Nanakuli-Mailii Neighborhood Board No. 36 again expressed its support of any action that would change this park's name to Kalanianaole Beach Park; and

WHEREAS, Nanakuli Beach Park is a 39.63 acre park located at 89-269 Farrington Highway, Waianae, Hawaii, with several facilities, including indoor recreational buildings, basketball and volleyball courts, campsites, and comfort stations; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that returning the name of Nanakuli Beach Park to Kalanianaole Beach Park is both an appropriate way to commemorate Prince Jonah



RESOLUTION

Kuhio Kalaniana'ole's lifetime of compassionate and committed civic service to the people of Hawaii, and meets the naming criteria requirements set in ordinance; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City and County of Honolulu that Nanakuli Beach Park be renamed Kalaniana'ole Beach Park; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council requests the City administration to erect appropriate signage and approves the placement of such signage at the park; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor, the Director of Parks and Recreation, the state Department of Hawaiian Home Lands and the Nanakuli-Mailii Neighborhood Board No. 36.


