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Written Testimony

Good morning Chair Anderson, Vice Chair Ozawa and members of the Zoning Committee. My name is Mary Jean Castillo, a resident and board member of Moanalua Village. On behalf of Moanalua Village residents and homeowners, first and foremost, I'd like to thank you for your efforts to bring forth a very real problem of traffic congestion in Red Hill-Moanalua area specifically Ala Kapuna and Monalualani Place intersection. Heavy traffic congestion is imminent during morning & afternoon rush hours when the parents transporting their children to and from the elementary school located inside Moanalua Hillside Apartment. This intersection was labeled as the "nation's worst bottleneck." The impact of building another 500 units will ultimately cost the City & State government money in the future. In my opinion, it will be wise to share the cost with the developer NOW or pay for it later at the expense of taxpayers. Over the years, the street parking situation has also become a nightmare. I myself has been parking everyday over a 1 mile away from home ever since the Plaza Assisted Living was built in 2014. Douglas Emmett planned of

providing only 1 parking per unit. My question to the developer would be: where do you expect 500 more cars to park? The one simple measure we requested to Douglas Emmett back in June 2015, was to put a STOP sign in the intersection so the cars coming out of the Moanalua Hillside apartment will slow down. To date, I have not seen any efforts from the developer to address that concern. It is a safety issue and they need to address it immediately. We, the Moanalua residents urge the Zoning Committee to please VOTE to pass Bill 11 (2016). Mahalo for your consideration.
