Happy Holidays!

The City & County Gardener's Handbook (2011, revised), page 2, paragraph 3, reads:
"Each of the Community Gardens is self-governed."

I'm reaching out to you for assistance regards a problematic pattern of behavior by the City & County Community Garden Coordinator, Wayne Sasaki. Wayne has been micro-managing and usurping the elected governing boards at mine and other O'ahu community gardens.

At the Ala Wai Community Garden Association's (AWCGA) April 2016 monthly membership meeting, Mr. Sasaki informed us that it was not allowed for a member to enter another gardener's plot if that gardener wasn't present, even with permission from the gardener (see attached meeting minutes). Since then I've had to deal with numerous stressful incidents of members who have confronted other members for violating Wayne's *No Entry Rule*.

In an extension of Wayne's, *No Entry Rule*, two AWCGA members have contacted me and informed me that while they were watering their neighbors garden plot from outside the fence, Wayne (on a periodic visit to the AWCG) had informed them that they were not allowed nto do this, either.

Additionally, just prior to the December AWCGA membership vote on the new by-laws, Wayne Sasaki stood and publicly urged the members not to vote for approval. His claim was that some of them were likely illegal. Is a C&C Dept. of Parks and Recreation representative supposed to do that?

I would like to recommend in the future, that if Wayne declares any new policy or procedure, he do so via writing on a C & C letterhead. This would greatly facilitate clarity and more easily allow gardens to seek redress.

Please note that Wayne has announced the same *No Entry Rule* policy at various other Community gardens whose representatives have also signed this letter.

DRAFT MINUTES

Officers Present: Wade Rhein (President), Nani Picerno-Manrique Nash (Vice-President), Stephanie Visaya Bose (Treasurer), Cristina Spuler (Secretary), and Jamie Jameson (Applications Officer)

Members Present: 64

- I. Call to order by President Wade (C01) at 6pm
- II. A motion to approve the April agenda was made by Al (D31), and seconded by Wes (A08). Motion was approved.
- III. Approval of Draft Minutes
 - a. Wade prefers narrative style.
 - b. A motion to approve the March minutes was made by Georgi (B28), and seconded by David (D08). Motion was approved.
- IV. President Report: Wade (C01)
 - a. Of 39 plots broken into last month 10 plot owners completed and submitted available HPD forms.
 - b. Wade wrote an addendum and posted it on our bulletin board.
 1. Suggestion to place spy camera facing bulletin board has been noted.
 2. No objection to those wishing to install their own camera in their own plot.
- V. VP Report: Nani (D29)
 - a. 16 plot owners have followed up on last month's request to have visible plot number signs and 13 gardens still needs to follow up: Row A: 4, 5, 12, 30, 39 Row B: 3, 4, 8, 20, 32, 33
 - b. A13 & B6's screens impede view of their gardens.
 - c. Plots that appear abandoned are: Row B: 27, 32, 34, 36 Row C: 37
- VI. Treasurer Report: Stephanie (A24)
 - a. Passed out report will be corrected at next month's meeting.
 - b. This month's five (5) door prizes are compliments of American Savings Bank at Market City.
Winners are: Mihn (D15) & Geri (B13) received ASB towels
Anna (D21) & Keiko (B11) received ASB tote bags
Jenet (D16) received an ASB canvas bag
- VII. Application Officer Report: Jamie (B22)
 - a. Reminder: applicants cannot miss more than two meetings if you wish to avoid having to reapply and start anew.
 - b. Five gardens are available tonight: B08, B25, B33, C07 & D22.
 1. Top of current member wait list A36 will take B25.
 2. No other takers on current member wait list willing to take available plots, new applicant wait list will be used.
 - a. Laura Koonce (top of current applicant attendees) accepted B33.
 - b. Cindy Richardson & Joyce George accepted C07.
 - c. Janet Josh initially declined and then accepted D22.
 - d. Cindy Mendonca accepted B08.
- VIII. Community Recreational Garden Coordinator Report: Wayne Sasaki
 - a. Apologizes that he was not at last month's meeting, he was on vacation.

- b. Reminds new plot owners that user fee & dues must be paid before they can be considered official garden members. If they don't pay they can have their plot taken back.
- c. Vehicles are not allowed to be driven in the public area between the school fence and row A, only authorized vehicles are allowed. Also, no vehicles are allowed on the bike pathway.
- d. Permanent structures such as concrete poles/posts or hollowed tiles (walls) are not allowed and plots with permanent structures are forewarned that they may be asked to take them down at a future date.
- e. Please get approval from Wayne before getting any noncommercial mulch (tree trimmings) dumped at the community garden. We are trying to avoid getting any pest such as the Rhinoceros Beetle and Little Fire Ants at our garden. Any gardener allowing illegal dumping will risk having your plot taken away as that mulch may have infestation. Current mulch pile front of our gardens was not approved. Also, newly brought in mulch must be used or spread immediately to avoid infestation. This can be timed with workdays.
- f. No one can enter other gardener's plots unless the plot owner is also present inside that plot.
- g. Plot owners may not exchange gardens directly with each other. They must go thru the wait list process and have their names on transfer waitlist.
- h. Cookbooks still for sale and flyers showing botanical gardens' class schedules given by our botanical gardens are available.

IX. Old Business

- a. Iolani Fun Fair sign-up sheets are available here as spots are still available for the two day fair.
 - 1. Kelli, our Iolani Liaison, says that each shift is 3-4 hours and those who signed up will be contacted once the shifts have been finalized.
- b. Draft by-laws.
 - 1. Per Wade, we will have an up or down vote by June 2016. If 51% of attendee members vote for approval, it will be registered with the C&C. Those wishing to comment have two minutes to do so and can also contact Treasurer Stephanie to help with the by-law committee.
- a) Danita (A22) points out the \$18 user fee has no flexible wording should C&C decide to raise it.
- b) Eva & Gina would like us to go over Robert's Rule of Orders and President Wade agreed to this request while pointing out that it is available online. Also, a book is available and can be available by placing it at the entry table during the monthly meetings.
- c. President Wade requests a formation of a committee to resolve Jan Halpenny's payment impasse. There is a difference of \$400 between what she feels she is owed and amount determined by Treasurer Stephanie according to valid receipts she submitted.
 - 1. Georgie (B28) asked if the Board had all the receipts and Pat (A22) asked if they met the less than \$200 minimum purchase not subject to a vote requirement and Treasurer Stephanie replied yes to both questions.

X. New Business

- a. Stephanie has put up a donated cork board alongside the shed fence and members may post garden related info such as plant/seedling swaps, recipes etc. with a time limit of 14 days.

XI. Next Meeting & Clean-up

- a. Meeting: Monday May 1, 2016 at 6 PM sharp @ Iolani School's Sullivan Center.
- b. Clean-up with Stephanie as host on Saturday, April 16, 2016 from 8 am to 10 am, and Jaime as host on Sunday, April 17, 2016 from 3 pm to 5 pm.

- IV. President Wade's Report: each member received a yellow ballot upon sign in and Floor Nominations will be conducted & elections of 2017 officers and Yes/No of by-laws to follow

Wade asks for application officer: both Nani D28 & Donna A22 nominate themselves. Wade give Nani and Donna 2 minutes to speak which both do. Wade then closes the nominations and asks each attendee to deposit their completed yellow ballots to a designated box held by a garden council member & outside monitor
