1947 ACTIVITIES

1. CLERICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:
RECORDING AND REPORTING:

During the year 1947, 57 meetings of the Board of Supervisors were held. 21 Public Hearings were scheduled before the Board, on bills pending, on public improvements, improvement districts, on the increase in water rates, on the abandonment of streets, etc.

234 Messages from the Mayor, 2256 Departmental Communications, 956 Miscellaneous Communications, and 89 Petitions were received and acted upon, a total of 3535, as against 2663 for 1946.

3514 Committee Reports and 716 Resolutions of the Board were presented and acted upon, as against 2874 Committee Reports and 505 Resolutions for the year 1946.

76 Bills were introduced, of which 50 were enacted into Ordinances; 19 were tabled and 6 remained pending at the close of the year. Ordinances enacted by the Board since its creation in 1905 now total 1099. The Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1942, the last published volume of Ordinances, include up to Ordinance No. 940.

As of December 31, 1947, Resolutions of the City Planning Commission, which have the force and effect of Ordinances, total 259, 37 of which were enacted during the year 1947. In addition, the City Planning Commission granted a total of 23 Variance Permits during the year. These Resolutions and Variance Permits have been certified by the Clerk and are on file and of record in his office.

Plans and specifications on 36 projects were advertised and issued during the year. Contracts on 33 of these projects were awarded by the Board of Supervisors, for an aggregate contract price of approximately \$2,128,446.00. Bids on three projects were rejected. A list of the contracts awarded is shown on pages 56 and 57 of this report. It is anticipated that the number of contracts to be awarded in the coming year will substantially increase, as many new projects are now being planned by the City and County, for new school buildings, fire stations, street improvements, sewer improvements, etc.

132 Master Plumbers' Bonds were received, approved and filed with the City and County Treasurer.

184 documents - deeds, assignments, easements, agreements, etc., were approved for signature by the Mayor and Clerk, as against 106 in

1946.

The 1947 Legislature repealed the M-Day Act, under which the issuance of permits to exhibit motion picture shows and legitimate stage productions on Sundays was suspended during the war years. Beginning with July 1, 1947, this office resumed the issuance of these permits, and for the period from July 1 to December 31, 1947, 211 such permits were issued.

A comparative summary, covering the past five years, and showing the work passing through the office of City and County Clerk, as ex-officio Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, is appended hereto, on page 10.

Beginning with 1933, this department has maintained a subject index covering all matters acted upon by the Board of Supervisors. This work requires the full-time services of one clerk, and is increasing in volume each year. This index has proved of invaluable assistance not only to this department, but to every department of the City and County, and is constantly in use. It would be impossible to keep track of the countless requests, claims, complaints, reports, resolutions, and other matters flowing through this department to the Board of Supervisors, without such an index.

II. REGISTRATION OF VOTERS: ELECTIONS:

No elections were held in 1947. The 1946 elections were reported on in the annual report for that year. Registrations in that election were the heaviest in the history of this City and County, and it is anticipated that the 1948 elections will show a large increase in registration over the 1946 total registration of 65,289, and the total of votes cast of 54,750.

As of December 31, 1947, the number of registered voters, adding new registrations and restorations, and deducting those voters ineligible because of death and convictions of felonies, totaled 54,729.

Amendments to certain of the election laws were made during the 1947 session of the Legislature, among them being:

- Act 131 (S.B.59) Special election to be held for Honolulu officers (other than Supervisors) disqualified after election and before taking office. Places of disqualified Supervisor to be taken by unsuccessful supervisorial candidate receiving largest vote.
- Act 151 (S.B.161) Permits the County Clerk to designate subordinates to perform duties on registration of electors.
- Act 154 (S.B.267) Deletes prohibition against full-time public officers and employees serving as Inspectors of Elections.

- Act 155 (S.B.268) Permits disabled voters to receive assistance of qualified voter in marking ballot. Heretofore this assistance was given by an election inspector.
- Act 156 (S.B.270) Increases minimum and maximum number of inspectors of Elections for precincts with more than 800 registered voters. Provides for division of work, 2 chairmen, and employment of two clerks by each set of inspectors.
- Act 159 (S.B.470) Eliminates requirement for posting specimen ballots outside of polling places. Statements of election inspectors to be filed with county clerks for candidates for county offices.
- Act 242 (S.B.489) Provides for voting by ill or disabled registered voters confined to their homes and unable to attend polls, the same as is given inmates in hospitals.

A bill to change the date of the primary election from October to September, in order to allow a little more time between elections to prepare the election lists and have the same printed, was requested by this department, and introduced in the Legislature, but failed to pass. Under the present law, this office is compelled to prepare the final lists for the general election in a period of about two weeks, and with the large increase in the number of registered voters, this entails a vast amount of preparation, listing and checking, and all employees of the department are required to work day and night, including Sundays, in order that these lists of registered voters may be made ready for election day.

The Secretary of Hawaii is now considering the advisability of creating new precincts by dividing up precincts which now have over 1500 registered voters. If this is done, this office will have to reallocate voters to the proper precinct, involving much painstaking and careful checking.

Two temporary employees, both Assistant Clerk-Typists, who were carried over from 1946, were made permanent employees, and they will continuously work on election records, which will relieve other employees needed for board and pension work. The position of Administrative Assistant, which has been unfilled, has been allowed by the Board of Supervisors, and will be filled shortly. This employee will be assigned to supervise all phases of election work.

III. PENSION ADMINISTRATION:

- (a) Pension Fund for Policemen, Firemen and Bandsmen:
(Part 1, Chapter 121, Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945:

The Board of Trustees of the Pension Fund for Policemen, Firemen and Bandsmen, appointed by the Mayor, with the approval of the Board, for

terms of four years, consists of three members, with the City and County Clerk as ex officio Secretary. All administration work of the fund is handled in this office. The present trustees are:

Mr. Y. F. Zane, Chairman

As of January 1, 1947, there were 215 pensioners, including policemen, firemen and bandsmen, their widows and dependent children under sixteen years of age, receiving pensions and allowances. During the year 21 new pensions were granted, 13 pensioners died, and seven minor children reached age sixteen and their allowances were cancelled, so that as of December 31, 1947, there were 216 persons receiving pensions and allowances.

For the payment of pensions and allowances, and expenses incident thereto, the Board appropriated a total of \$224,215.00. All but approximately \$400.00 of this appropriation was expended.

(b) City and County Pension Board:
(Part 2, Chapter 121, Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945).

The members of this Board at present are:

The members of this Board are appointed by the Mayor, with the approval of the Board of Supervisors, for terms of five years.

As of December 31, 1946, there were 47 pensioners on the active list. During the year, 18 new pensions were granted, and seven pensioners died, so that as of December 31, 1947, there were 58 persons receiving pensions under this Board.

An appropriation of \$21,000.00 was allowed by the Board of Supervisors for the payment of pensions. Of this amount, approximately \$19,322.00 was expended.

Dr. Joseph A. Pekelo, for many years Chairman of this Board, found it necessary due to pressure of other business, to submit his resignation, and Dr. A. K. Kaonohi was, on January 24, 1947, appointed to fill his place. I desire to express my deep appreciation to Dr. Pekelo, and to the other members of this Board, as well as to the Trustees of the Pension Fund for Policemen, Firemen and Bandsmen, for their interest and untiring efforts to administer these Boards fairly and to the best interests of both the City and County and the individual pensioners.

(c) **Legislative P ensions:**

(Mandated and provided for by special Acts of the Legislature
to be paid for by the City and County of Honolulu)

On January 2, 1947, the administration of Legislative pensions, previously handled in the office of the Mayor, was turned over to this Department.

As of December 31, 1946, there were 84 persons receiving pensions under special acts of the Legislature. The Legislature of 1947, by Act 241, granted a pension of \$74.58 per month to Ida Moriz Perry, and the widow of a deceased pensioner was granted a \$60.00 widow's pension. Six pensioners died during the year. As of December 31, 1947, therefore, there were 80 pensioners receiving legislative pensions. An appropriation of \$52,500.00 was provided by the Board of Supervisors for the payment of these legislative pensions. Of this amount, there was expended approximately 48,450.00.

Schedules giving the names of pensioners, the amount of pension, and the date granted, are shown in this report, on pages 30 to 55 inclusive.

PERSONNEL:

As of December 31, 1947, this department had thirteen employees, including the City and County Clerk. One position, viz., Administrative Assistant, CAF-9, was unfilled. This position, however, will be filled very shortly, so that for the year 1948 the department will have fourteen permanent employees. In addition, request has been made in the 1947 Annual Budget, for ten additional employees to be employed on a temporary basis for the election period.
