



During the year 1949, 60 meetings of the Board of Supervisors were held. The Board also held 32 public hearings on bills pending, on public improvements, improvement districts, the abandonment of streets, the exchange of lands, on civil service, etc.

252 Messages from the Mayor, 2606 Departmental Communications, 1057 Miscellaneous Communications and 111 Petitions were received and acted upon, a total of 4026. 3838 Committee Reports (1021 Finance, 2801 Public Works and 16 Legislative) and 752 Resolutions of the Board were presented and acted upon.

49 Bills were introduced, of which 41 were enacted into Ordinances, 2 were tabled and 6 are still pending. A list of these Bills and Ordinances is appended to this report, on pages 24 to 29 inclusive.

27 Resolutions of the City Planning Commission were approved, and one (No. 324 - providing for the exclusion from the Master Plan Section 3, Kalia-Waikiki, of a portion of the area set aside for Waikiki Beach Expansion) was rejected. 13 Variance Permits granted by the City Planning Commission were approved by the Board. A list of these Resolutions and Variance permits is made a part of this report, on pages 30 to 34 inclusive.

Bids covering 54 public projects were opened in this office during the year, and submitted to the Board for award of contract, involving the expenditure of public funds in the sum of \$6,287,583.07 as against 34 contracts totaling \$4,487,223.55 for the previous year. It is estimated that during 1950 an even larger number of contracts will be awarded. A list of the contracts awarded is shown on pages 60 to 62.

142 Master Plumbers' Bonds were received, approved and filed with the City and County Treasurer as required by law. 255 documents, - deeds, assignments, easements, agreements, etc., were approved for signature by the Mayor and Clerk and processed through this department. 321 Permits for the exhibition of motion picture shows and legitimate stage productions on Sundays were issued during the year.

This office also has charge of the sale and issuance of copies of the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1942. During the year a total of 111 volumes were issued, - 24 were issued to various departments and governmental agencies without cost, and the balance were sold at \$5.00 each.

A comparative summary, covering a period of five years, and showing the work passing through the office of the City and County Clerk as ex officio Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, is made a part of this report, on page 16.

## II. REGISTRATION OF VOTERS - ELECTIONS:

No elections were held during 1949.

As of December 31, 1948, there were 68,441 registered voters eligible to vote. New registrations, reinstatements and transfers totaled 360. Deletions from the total registered voters because of death, convictions of felonies, transfers, etc., totaled 327. As of December 31, 1949, therefore, the total number of qualified voters was 68,474. It is estimated that approximately 8000 new registrations and reinstatements will be received for the election of Delegates to the Constitutional Convention to be held in February of 1950.

A tabulation covering registered voters is attached to this report, on page 17.

New laws affecting elections enacted by the Legislature during 1949 were as follows:

### Regular Session:

#### Act 51 (G. B. 322) - providing for a closed primary election:

This act establishes a closed primary for territorial and county elections. Voters will call for and receive ballots without disclosing their party preferences, but must mark their ballots only for candidates for the same party or only for non-partisan candidates. Cross voting will void a ballot.

Previous to 1913, candidates for public office were elected by party conventions. By Act 151, Session Laws of 1913, open primary elections were established, and were continued in force up to and including the elections held in 1948. The legislature in the Regular Session of 1949 enacted Act 51, providing for a closed primary, and therefore the primary election of 1950 will be a closed party primary. There was a good deal of opposition to this measure, and it passed by a small majority. A bill was introduced in the Special Session to repeal this law, but failed to pass.

Act 51, however, did not amend the statute relating to the color of paper to be used in the various ballots, and for this reason separate ballots of the required color will still be used, so that it will be possible for a voter to cast one ballot for democratic candidates, and another ballot for republican candidates. For instance, a voter may vote for Supervisors on the Democratic ticket, and for Members of the Legislature on the Republican Ticket.

Act 309 (S. B. 144) - Re Great Register:

This act changes the form of the Great Register so as to eliminate the necessity of keeping blank pages attached, and requires separate volumes for each precinct.

Act 318 (S. B. 462) - Providing for use of Voting Machines:

This Act provides for the experimental use of voting machines in Honolulu precincts with over 800 registered voters for primary and general elections, and appropriates \$12,500 for such purpose. It creates a Voting Machine Board of five members, consisting of the Secretary of Hawaii, the Clerk of the City and County of Honolulu, the Superintendent of Public Works of the Territory, and two other persons who shall not belong to the same political party, to select voting machines and assure their operation in conformance with law, and also establishes procedures for use of voting machines.

The Governor has not yet named the two members of the Board and it is not contemplated that these voting machines will be used in the election of Delegates for the Constitutional Convention. They will probably be installed in certain precincts in the General Election.

Act 334 (H. B. 1) - Providing for a Constitutional Convention:

Provides for holding a constitutional convention, the adoption of a state constitution and for its submission to Congress for approval. The Convention, to consist of 63 delegates to be elected by representative districts as follows: first district, 8; second district, 4; third district, 9; fourth district, 18; fifth district, 18; sixth district, 6. Primary election will be held on call of the Governor within 270 days from May 20, 1949, and the general election within 40 days from the primary. The constitution adopted by the convention is to be referred to the Legislature for review, and modifications recommended by it are to be separately listed when the proposed constitution is submitted to the voters for ratification. The Act appropriates \$250,000 for salaries and expenses of delegates and of the convention and elections, said sum to be expended under the supervision of the Secretary of Hawaii.

Under this Act, the Governor issued his proclamation calling for a primary election to be held on February 11, 1950. The Great Register of voters will be open to receive new registrations until January 12, 1950. It will be reopened on February 12 and remain open until February 16, 1950, to receive registrations for the general election, which will be held on March 21, 1950. Nominations of candidates will be received in the office of the Secretary of Hawaii until midnight January 22, 1950.

Six temporary employees have been assigned to this office to assist in the registration of voters for the Constitutional Convention elections, for a period of three and a half months, their salaries being paid by the Secretary of Hawaii. By Committee Report No. 3751 and Resolution No. 734, adopted December 27, 1949, the Board of Supervisors authorized the appointment of ten temporary registrars to serve without pay, to assist in the registration.

Act 399 (S. B. 587) - Establishing additional voting booths:

This Act directs the Governor to establish one or more voting units in each precinct having over 700 registered voters where a voting machine is not used, and instructs the county clerks to apportion voters among the booths or units in each precinct. It also provides for two election inspectors for each booth or unit established, who, together with the chairman of the board of election inspectors, for the precinct, constitute the election board for the particular booth or unit. Two clerks are to be employed for each booth or unit.

Act 12, Special Session 1949 (S. B. 35) - Re appointment of Election Inspectors:

This Act restores the provision that in case of the failure of any election inspector to serve, the governor shall, as far as practicable, appoint a person of the same political party to fill his place. It provides also that if the governor cannot be reached to make such an appointment in time for an election, the remaining inspector or inspectors shall make such appointment.

Primary and General Elections of 1950 for Members of the Legislature and County and City and County Officers:

The regular Primary and General elections for the election of members of the Territorial Legislature and for County and City and County Officers, will be held during 1950. The Primary election will be held on October 7th and the General Election on November 7th. It is estimated that the registered vote will reach a total of more than 75,000 for that election.

Request has been made in the annual budget for the employment of fifteen temporary clerks to assist in the registration of voters and preparation of election lists, in addition to two temporary clerks carried over from 1949. These temporary clerks will be employed for varying periods of six, eight, ten and twelve months, and an appropriation of approximately \$28,500 has been requested to cover salaries for such temporary employees.

Additional units to be established in precincts having more than 700 voters, as provided by Act 399, Session Laws of 1949, will result in the establishment of a greatly increased number of voting booth units, with separate voting lists for each voting booth.

Conference of County Clerks and Staff of the Secretary of Hawaii:

A conference of all County Clerks and the staff of the Secretary of Hawaii was held in Hilo, Hawaii, on Saturday, November 26, 1949. The conference was called for the purpose of discussing procedures for the election of delegates to the Constitutional Convention, and for matters relating to elections in general. Representatives from all counties attended, as well as members of the staff of the Secretary of Hawaii. It was the concensus that this Conference was highly satisfactory and educational, and will result in a more uniform handling of elections throughout the Territory. It is recommended that these conferences be held annually, when problems arising in election work may be fully discussed and proper procedures outlined.

III. PENSION ADMINISTRATION:

(a) Pension Fund for Policemen, Firemen and Bandsmen  
(Part 1, Chapter 121, Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945)

This pension fund is administered by a Board of three trustees, appointed by the Mayor with the approval of the Board of Supervisors for terms of four years. The City and County Clerk is by law the ex officio Secretary of the Board and all administrative and clerical work is handled by his office. The present trustees are:

Mr. Y. F. Zane, former Chairman of the Commission and who had served well and faithfully as such for many years, died on June 14, 1949, and Mr. Joseph J. McGettigan was named as Chairman in his place. The term of Mr. Richard N. Mossman, member, expired on June 30, 1949, and Mr. Francis Yee was appointed by the Mayor in his place.

As of January 1, 1949, there were 228 recipients of pensions and allowances, including policemen, firemen and bandsmen, their widows and dependent children under sixteen years of age. During 1949, ten new pensions and allowances were granted, six pensioners passed away, and seven minors reached the age of sixteen years so that as of December 31, 1949, there were a total of 225 persons receiving pensions and allowances under this system.

There are at this time 14 police officers, 38 firemen and 6 bandsmen still eligible for pensions under this system, a total of 58. It is felt that the number of beneficiaries under this system will reach its peak in a comparatively short period of time, and will then begin to decrease so that eventually this pension system will be eliminated as all police officers, firemen and bandsmen employed after December 31, 1927, are included in the Employees Retirement System.

For the payment of pensions and allowances and for administration expenses, a total appropriation of \$242,100 was allowed. Of this total, approximately \$240,281.00 has been expended or encumbered.

(b) City and County Pension System:  
(Part 2, Chapter 121, Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945)

The City and County Pension Board, consisting of five members, appointed by the Mayor with the approval of the Board of Supervisors for terms of five years, has supervision over all city and county pensions covering employment by the City and County who are not members of the Employees Retirement System. The Board consists of the following:

The City and County Clerk is also ex officio Secretary of this Pension Board, and all administrative work is done in his office.

The Board is empowered to grant pensions to employees of the City and County who have had a minimum of ten years of service, and to the widows of such employees. Pensions are granted upon the employee reaching age 60, or for disability. With very few exceptions, pensioners under this system receive the minimum pension of \$30.00 per month, plus the cost of living bonus of \$25.00 per month.

The Legislature in the Regular Session, by Act 376, reduced the bonus to pensioners, so that no pensioner receiving \$55.00 per month or over received any bonus, and any pensioners receiving less than \$55.00 were allowed a bonus sufficient to bring the minimum up to \$55.00. This created great hardship among many pensioners, and by Act 32 of the Special Session, 1949, Act 376 of the Regular Session was repealed, and the full bonus restored to all pensioners, beginning November 1, 1949.

As of December 31, 1948, there were 71 persons receiving pensions under this system. During the year new pensions were granted, and one pensioner passed away, so that as of December 31, 1949, there were 91 pensioners on the active list receiving pensions. Three of these pensioners are paid by the Board of Water Supply and 88 by the City and County.

For the payment of pensions under this system, the Board appropriated the sum of \$26,000.00. On August 2, 1949, by Resolution No. 368, an additional sum of \$4,700.00 was appropriated, making a total appropriation of \$30,700.00. Of this total appropriation, the sum of approximately \$30,000.00 was expended during the year.

(c) Legislative Pensions:

(Mandated by Special Acts of the Legislature to be  
paid for by the City and County of Honolulu:

Pensions granted by special acts of the Legislature, and mandated to be paid by the City and County of Honolulu, are also administered in the office of the City and County Clerk.

As of December 31, 1948, there were 73 persons receiving pensions under Special Acts of the Legislature. During the year five pensioners died, and widows of two of such pensioners were automatically granted \$50.00 widow's pensions, so that as of December 31, 1949, there were 70 pensioners receiving pensions under special acts of the Legislature. Neither the Regular Session nor the Special Session of the Legislature in 1949 granted any new pensions.

A total appropriation of \$44,040.00 was provided to cover pensions under this system. Of this sum a total of approximately \$42,315.00 was expended.

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A list of all pensioners under the three systems, giving the effective dates of the pensions, the amounts, and the reasons why such pensions were granted, is incorporated in this report, on pages 35 to 59 inclusive.

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The Legislature in neither the Regular nor the Special Sessions of 1949 took any action whatsoever on the recommendations made by the Territorial Retirement and Pension Commission, appointed under Act 219, Session Laws of Hawaii 1945, which report was submitted to the Regular Session of 1949. It is possible that this report and its recommendations may be studied by the Joint Legislative Holdover Committee, now functioning.

PERSONNEL:

As of December 31, 1949, this Department had fourteen permanent employees, including the City and County Clerk, and two temporary employees, a total of 16. Beginning December 20, 1949, six additional temporary clerks were assigned to this office by the Secretary of Hawaii to assist in the registration of voters and the preparation of election lists for the elections, primary and general, for delegates to the Constitutional Convention which will be held in April 1950. These clerks will be employed for a period of three and one half months.

As stated under the heading of Elections, request has been made for fifteen temporary clerks, in addition to the two temporary clerks carried over from 1949, to assist in the 1950 elections.

OFFICE EXPENDITURES:

A tabulation, showing the total appropriations made for the operation of this department, and the expenditures therefrom, is hereto appended, on pages 63 and 64.
