

- (a) CLERICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS;
RECORDING AND REPORTING:

The City and County Clerk is by law Ex Officio Secretary of the Board of Supervisors, and as such his office handles all administrative work of the Board. The Clerk or his Deputy and an Administrative Assistant attend all meetings of the Board of Supervisors and all public hearings before the Board. They are required to take minutes of all meetings and record the same, and when necessary, to make verbatim transcripts of certain public hearings.

The Clerk is required to prepare the original Journal of the Board of Supervisors, containing a full and complete record of all matters considered and acted upon by the Board. This Journal for the two year term for which the Mayor and Members of the Board of Supervisors are elected, covers a total of approximately 10,000 pages of typewriting, on large sheets 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ x 14 $\frac{1}{4}$ ". These sheets are bound into permanent books and filed away for reference and safekeeping.

All communications and petitions addressed to the Mayor and Board are received by the Clerk and submitted to the Board for action at its regular meetings. Following the meetings, all communications, petitions, reports and resolutions are numbered, indexed and filed away, and ditto copies are prepared for reference to the Standing Committees of the Board, and for distribution to the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, Departments and other persons indicated. Communications addressed to the Mayor and Board are, following each meeting, acknowledged by the Clerk and the writers advised of the action taken by the Board thereon.

All bills introduced are received, numbered and published, and after approval by the Mayor, are again numbered as Ordinances, and published, and reprints made for general distribution. Certain Resolutions of the Board, upon enactment are also published. Resolutions adopted by the City Planning Commission, and approved by the Board of Supervisors, are received and filed in this office, and published.

A full and complete subject index of all matters brought to the attention of the Board of Supervisors is prepared on index cards. At the end of

the year, this subject index is retyped on large sheets which are later bound into permanent volumes for ready reference. ✓ Formerly, one clerk was able to carry on this work, but owing to the continuously increasing volume of business, an additional clerk was employed and for the last two or three years, their time has been fully occupied in bringing this very important work to date. This subject index is used by all departments of the City, and without it any research of the records would be extremely laborious and well-nigh impossible. The index was inaugurated in 1933; prior to that time, and back to the inception of county government, there is no subject index. This index should be completed back to 1905, in order that there may be a complete subject index from the beginning of county government, but this is not possible with the present staff, as they are barely able to keep up the current index. If funds could be provided for the employment of two index clerks for one year, I believe this index could be completed. However, I have been advised that because of the scarcity of available funds, no new positions will be allowed in the coming year. I therefore submit this matter for your consideration and study, with the recommendation that as soon as funds are available, the necessary positions may be created for this very important and necessary work.

During the year 1951, 59 meetings of the Board were held, and 26 public hearings were held on bills pending, on public improvements, off-street parking, rent control, abandonment of streets, sewer projects, etc.

274 Messages from the Mayor, 2952 Department Communications, 1095 Miscellaneous Communications, and 95 Petitions were received and acted upon, a total of 4142. 4330 Committee Reports (1198 Finance, 3123 Public Works and 9 Legislative) were presented and acted upon, and 843 Resolutions were presented and acted upon.

48 Bills were introduced, of which 45 (including 6 pending from 1950) were enacted into Ordinances, 5 tabled, 2 referred back to Committees, and 2 are pending. A list of these bills and ordinances is appended to this report, on pages 45 to 51 inclusive.

41 Resolutions and 11 Variance Permits granted by the City Planning Commission were approved by the Board, and listed on pages 52 to 57 inclusive.

Bids covering 54 public projects were opened in this office during 1950 and submitted to the Board for award of contract, involving the expenditure of public funds in the sum of approximately \$3,619,974.52. A list of these contracts, showing the project, amount of contract and the successful bidder, is shown on pages 64 to 67 inclusive.

152 Master Plumbers Bonds were received, approved by the Board and filed with the City and County Treasurer as required by law. 483 documents, - deeds, leases, assignments, grants, easements, agreements, licenses, releases, etc., were approved for signature by the Mayor and Clerk and processed through this Department.

(b) GENERAL INFORMATION; MISCELLANEOUS DUTIES:

The office of the City and County Clerk is the clearing house for information of all types concerning the City and County. Mail for various departments is received and routed through this office. Inquiries are received from all parts of the mainland, requesting information, requesting copies of birth certificates, requesting copies of divorce decrees, and these have to be referred to the proper agencies of government for attention and reply. In addition, many hundreds of persons call at the counter of this office during the course of the year seeking information as to various functions and departments of the City and County.

The sale and issuance of copies of the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1942, is handled by this office. During the year a total of 37 volumes was issued - 25 were sold at \$5.00 each and 12 were issued to various governmental agencies, without cost. There is urgent need for a new revision of the Ordinances of Honolulu. The last revision, issued in 1942, includes up to Ordinance No. 940. Since that revision 326 new ordinances have been enacted. When volumes of the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu are sold, copies of all ordinances enacted since that revision are furnished, but this is very unsatisfactory, and it is difficult for the layman to properly check on the laws. Under authorization by the Board of Supervisors, the City and County Attorney is presently working on a revision of the Ordinances, and it is hoped that this revision will be completed in the near future.

Another duty imposed on this office by the Board of Supervisors in 1950 was the preparation and transmittal of Resolutions of Condolence to the families of men and women in the armed services who were injured, missing or killed in the Korean War. During this year, 607 of such Resolutions were prepared and transmitted, each with an original letter of transmittal.

Oaths of Office of Department Heads, Members of Board and Commissions, are sworn to before the City and County Clerk, and filed in this office, together with oaths of allegiance and the new Loyalty oaths required by Act 256, S. L. 1951.

The City and County Clerk, with the Mayor executes all documents on behalf of the City and County, such as deeds, contracts, leases, licenses, etc., and these documents are routed to the proper depositories. In addition, the office of the Clerk is continuously called upon to furnish certified copies of Ordinances, Resolutions, Reports, etc., for use as evidence in court cases, and for other purposes.

As of January 1, 1952, this department had eighteen permanent employees, including the City and County Clerk, and three temporary employees. Nineteen temporary positions have been established by the Salary Ordinance, but these temporary positions, with the exception of the three carried over, are filled only during election years.

II. REGISTRATION OF VOTERS: ELECTIONS:

Elections are by law held in even-numbered years; hence no elections were held in 1951.

During non-election years, this Division is manned by one Administrative Officer and four assistants. The work of the division in non-election years is mainly concerned with checking election lists and correcting election records, registering voters and performing related work. It takes approximately one full year to completely and accurately check precinct lists against precinct rosters, and thereafter correct the Great Register of the City and County, and bring election records up to date. It is a tedious, painstaking and time-consuming task.

At the General election held in November 1950, the number of registered electors was increased from 88,952 to 93,353. The number of votes cast at that election was 76,236, a percentage of 81.66% of the total registered vote. It is estimated that for the coming elections in 1952, the total number of registered electors will be increased by approximately 8,000 thus bringing the total registered number to over 100,000. Ten years ago, in the general election of 1942, the total registered number was 48,084; hence in the period of ten years, the total registered vote has increased 44,267, or almost 100%.

The 1951 Legislature enacted the following laws relating to elections:

- Act 263 - relating to absentee voting only in the Counties of Hawaii and Maui.
- Act 303 - covering the expenses of the Boards of Registration, providing that members of such boards shall be paid \$12.00 per day of not less than six hours.
- Act 309 - amending Section 200.01 of the Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945, as enacted by Act 399, Session Laws of Hawaii 1949, relating to additional voting units in any precinct.
- Act 310 - providing that 30 days before a primary election, each party shall submit to the Secretary of the Territory and to the respective County Clerks, a list of officers of the Central Committee and County Committees.

As of December 31, 1950, the total registered voters was 76,186. New registrations during the year totaled 330; deletions caused by death and conviction of felony, amounted to 197; so that as of December 31, 1951, the total number of registered voters was 76,319, as shown by the following tabulation:

III. PENSION ADMINISTRATION

(a) Pension Fund for Policemen, Firemen and Bandsmen
(Part 1, Chapter 121, R. L. 1945, as amended.)

The Pension Fund for Policemen, Firemen and Bandsmen is administered by a Board of three Trustees, appointed by the Mayor with the approval of the Board of Supervisors for terms of four years. The City and County Clerk is by law ex officio Secretary of the Board, and all administrative and clerical work is handled by his office, and all records are filed there. The present Trustees are:

Seven meetings of the Board were held during 1951, after publication of notice thereof.

As of December 31, 1950, there were 219 persons receiving pensions and allowances under this system, which includes all policemen, firemen and bandsmen who were employed on or before December 31, 1927, and their widows and minor children under the age of sixteen years. Beginning January 1, 1928, all policemen, firemen and bandsmen automatically became members of the Employees Retirement System. There now remain 12 police officers, 35 firemen and 6 bandsmen who are still employed and eligible for retirement under this system, a total of 53. A list of these officers is appended to this report, on page 31.

During the year 1951, 4 police officers, 1 fireman, 1 bandsman and 2 widows passed away, and two minor children reached the age of sixteen years, thus terminating their pensions and allowances. New pensions were granted to 2 policemen, 4 firemen, 2 widows and five minor children, so that on December 31, 1951, there were 222 persons eligible to receive pensions and allowances under this system.

For the payment of pensions and allowances, a total appropriation of \$245,000.00 was provided by the Budget. In December of 1951, an additional appropriation of \$800.00 was provided by transfer of office funds, to cover a deficit, making a total of \$245,800.00. Of this sum approximately \$245,721.00 was expended. For administration expenses, out of a total appropriation of \$1100.00, the sum of approximately \$664.00 was expended.

Following is a list of pensioners under this system, giving the names, effective dates of the pensions, the amounts, and the reasons why such pensions were granted.

PENSIONS GRANTED AND IN EFFECT DURING THE YEAR 1950 UNDER THE PENSION

(b) City and County Pension System

The City and County Pension Board, consisting of five members, appointed by the Mayor with the approval of the Board of Supervisors for terms of five years, has supervision over all pensions granted to employees of the City and County and its predecessor, the County of Oahu, who are not members of the Employees Retirement System. The present members of the Board are:

The City and County Clerk is ex officio Secretary of this Pension Board, and all administrative work is done in his office.

This Board is authorized to grant pensions to employees of the City and County who have a minimum of ten years' of service and who are ineligible for membership in the Employees Retirement System of the Territory, and to widows of such employees. Pensions are granted upon the employees attaining the age of sixty years, or for physical disability. With very few exceptions, pensions under this system do not exceed the minimum of \$30.00 per month, and to this is added the cost of living bonus of \$25.00 per month. Act 247 of the Session Laws of Hawaii 1951, provided for the continuance of the bonus to pensioners until 1953.

As of December 31, 1950, there were 109 persons receiving pensions under this system. During the year ten new pensions were granted, eight pensioners passed away, and one widow remarried, thereby cancelling her pension, so that as of December 31, 1951, there were 110 pensioners on the active list receiving pensions. Three of these pensions are paid by the Board of Water Supply and 107 by the City and County.

The majority of applicants under this system are old employees of the Road, Building, Garbage and other departments who were compelled after 1946 to join the Retirement System, and after a short period reached retirement age, with only two or three years' membership in the system. Under Act 264, Session Laws of 1945, as amended, these persons were permitted to withdraw as members of the Retirement System, and make application under the City and County Pension System. By Act 65 of the Session Laws of Hawaii 1951, the time in which an employee may withdraw as a member of the Retirement System, and make application for a pension under the City and County Pension System, was extended to 1953.

\$42,000.00 was provided in the annual budget for the payment of pensions under this system. Of this amount the sum of approximately \$40,426.00 was expended,

(c) Legislative Pensions
Mandated by Special Acts of the Legislature
to be paid by the City and County of Honolulu

Pensions granted by special acts of the Legislature and mandated to be paid by the City and County of Honolulu, formerly handled in the office of the Mayor, have for the past five or six years been administered in the office of the City and County Clerk.

As of December 31, 1950, there were 67 persons receiving pensions under Special Acts of the Legislature. The 1951 Legislature denied all requests for legislative pensions, as did the Legislature of 1949, so that no new pensions have been granted by Legislative Act since the Session of 1947. However, as provided by Sections 631 and 6191 of the Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945, Mrs. Margaret K. Simeona, widow of Paona Simeona, a pensioner under the Road Fund, became automatically entitled to a widow's pension of \$30.00 per month, beginning December 27, 1951.

During the year four pensioners passed away, and the pension of one minor was cancelled on the attainment by such minor of the age limit, so that as of December 31, 1951, there were 63 persons receiving pensions under Special Acts of the Legislature, payable by the City and County of Honolulu, 26 under the General Fund and 37 under the Road Fund.

An appropriation of \$24,300.00 out of the General Fund, and an appropriation of \$16,475.00 out of the Road Fund, a total of \$40,775.00 was allotted in the 1951 Budget for the payment of these pensions, plus the cost of living bonus. Of this amount, approximately \$38,803 was expended. For the year 1952, because of the decrease in the number of beneficiaries, this office has requested the sum of \$37,280.00 for pensions, plus \$18,900.00 for the cost of living bonus provided by Act 247, S. L. 1951.
