

I. (a) CLERICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS;
RECORDING AND REPORTING.

The City and County Clerk is by law Ex Officio Secretary to the Board of Supervisors, and as such his office handles the huge volume of administrative work incident to the orderly and efficient operation of a legislative body of a large city and county having a population of approximately 328,000, and operating under an annual budget of more than \$22,500,000.00.

The Clerk or his deputy and an administrative officer attend all meetings of the Board of Supervisors and all public hearings before the Board. They are required to take minutes of all meetings and record the same, and when necessary, to make verbatim transcripts of certain public hearings.

The Clerk is required to prepare the original Journal of the Board of Supervisors, containing a full and complete record of all matters considered and acted upon by the Board. The Journal for the two year term for which the Mayor and Members of the Board are elected, covers a total of more than ten thousand pages of typewriting, on large sheets $9\frac{1}{2}'' \times 14\frac{1}{2}''$. These sheets are later compiled and bound into permanent volumes of approximately 600 pages each, each two-year term requiring about ten large volumes.

The present Board is the Twentieth Board of Supervisors of the City and County of Honolulu. The new Board, elected in November, 1952, will be the Twenty-First Board under City and County government, which began on January 4, 1909. From July 1, 1905 to January 4, 1909, County government prevailed, with a Chairman and seven members of the Board of Supervisors.

All communications and petitions addressed to the Mayor and Board are received in this office, numbered and submitted to the Board for action. Comparatively few of these communications and petitions are acted upon immediately, the great majority being assigned to the appropriate committee of the Board for consideration and action. The ministerial act of assigning these communications to the proper committees, which entails the reading and digesting of the contents of each communication, is placed upon the Mayor, but due to the increasing pressure of city and county business and increasing pressure and demands upon the time of the Mayor, this ministerial act has for some time been performed by this office. As an example of the increase in the volume of business in the past ten years, in 1952 the Board acted upon 4527 communications and petitions as against 1186 for 1942, and upon 4336 committee reports in 1952 as against 1493 for 1942. All communications received are acknowledged, and the writers advised as to what committee they have been referred to.

All Bills introduced are received, numbered, and published, and after enactment by the Board and approval by the Mayor, are again numbered as Ordinances and published as required by law, and reprints made for general distribution. Certain Resolutions of the Board, covering matters such as the final disposition of land, and the condemnation of land for public use, are, upon enactment, also published through this office. Resolutions adopted by the City Planning Commission, upon approval by the Board, are filed with

this office, and published, with reprints made for distribution through this office.

This office has since 1933 prepared and maintained a complete subject index of all matters brought to the attention of the Board of Supervisors. This index is first prepared on cards, and at the end of each year, is compiled, retyped and bound into permanent volumes for ready reference. It has proved to be of invaluable assistance to all departments of the City and County, and without such an index, any research of the records concerning the Board of Supervisors would be most difficult. It is not uncommon for other departments of the City and County to consult this index to find the disposition of matters affecting their departments which they are not able to find in their own offices. However, this index does not go back to the inception of county government, and I have repeatedly recommended, and at this time again recommend, that funds be allotted for personnel to complete this subject index from 1933 back to 1905.

During the year 81 meetings of the Board were held, and 37 public hearings were held on bills pending, on public improvements, off-street parking, rent control, taxi control, water and sewer projects, civil service, and the Petition for return of the property of Izumo Taisha Kyo Mission of Hawaii. The hearing involving the removal of Herbert Kum, Chairman, Civil Service Commission was an involved and protracted hearing, and has not as yet been disposed of. The hearing covering the Petition for the return of the property of the Izumo Taisha Kyo Mission of Hawaii also was protracted, and consumed many hours of time, with several night hearings. This hearing was concluded at the end of the year, and the Mayor and Clerk were authorized to sign a deed returning the property to the Mission.

270 Messages from the Mayor, 2973 Departmental Communications, 1446 Miscellaneous Communications and 108 Petitions were received and acted upon, a total of 4797. 4436 Committee Reports (1220 Finance, 3213 Public Works and 1 Special) were presented and acted upon, and 881 Resolutions were presented and acted upon.

68 Bills were presented and acted upon of which 56 (including 2 pending from 1951) were enacted into Ordinances, 2 referred back to Committees, 6 tabled or filed, and 4 are pending. A list of these bills and ordinances is appended to this report, on pages 53 to 61.

61 Resolutions and 23 Variance Permits granted by the City Planning Commission were approved by the Board, and these are listed on pages 62 to 71 inclusive.

Bids covering 67 public projects were opened in this office during 1952, and submitted to the Board for award of contract and approval of bond, on public works involving the expenditure of public funds in the sum of approximately \$8,257,381.00. A list of these contracts, showing the project, amount of contract and the successful bidder, is shown on pages 87 to 90. In connection with public contracts, this office handles the issuance of plans and specifications covering the various projects, to

prospective bidders, involving the receiving and paying out of cash amounting to several hundreds of thousands of dollars each year. A separate bank account is kept, into which moneys received for plans and specifications are deposited, and from which, upon the return of such plans and specifications, reimbursements are made to the contractors. A summary showing these payments and reimbursements is shown on page 91.

149 Master Plumbers' Bonds were received during 1952, submitted to the Board for approval, and upon approval, filed with the City and County Treasurer as required by law.

554 documents, including deeds, leases, assignments, grants, easements, agreements, licenses, releases, etc., were received, submitted to the Board for approval, and upon approval by the Board, by the City and County Attorney as to form, and by the Engineer's Department as to correctness of description and survey, were processed through this Department in conformity with the direction of the Board of Supervisors.

There was one change in the personnel of the Board of Supervisors during 1952. Sakae Takahashi, elected as a Supervisor in the 1950 election, resigned, effective as of January 15, 1952, to become the Treasurer of the Territory of Hawaii. Mr. Sakae Amano was appointed by the Mayor in place of Mr. Takahashi, and approved by the Board on January 29, 1952.

After the outbreak of the Korean War, the Board of Supervisors adopted the policy of sending resolutions of condolence to the families of service men injured, missing and killed. Since October 1950, more than 1300 of these resolutions have been transmitted from this office.

I. (b) GENERAL INFORMATION: PERSONNEL: APPROPRIATIONS:

The office of the City and County Clerk is the clearing house for information of all types concerning the City and County. Mail for various departments is received and routed through this office. Inquiries are received from all parts of the mainland, requesting information, requesting copies of birth certificates, marriage licenses and copies of divorce decrees, and these requests are referred to the proper agencies of government for attention and reply. In addition, many hundreds of persons call at the counters of this office during the course of the year seeking information as to the various functions and departments of the City and County.

The sale and issuance of copies of the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1942, are handled in this office. During the year a total of 49 volumes was issued - 33 sold at \$5.00 each, and 16 issued to various governmental agencies without cost. Since the revision of 1942, which included Ordinance 941, 382 Ordinances have been enacted by the Board of Supervisors, the last ordinance being No. 1322. When copies are sold, reprints of all ordinances enacted since the revision are furnished to the purchasers, but this is most unsatisfactory. There now remain for distribution and sale only 66 copies of the 1942 revision, and this number will most likely be exhausted by the end of this year, so that I again very strongly urge and recommend that a new revision of City and County Ordinances be undertaken immediately.

1952 being a Presidential Election year, the Clerk and his deputies were called upon to administer the oath on hundreds of absentee ballots mailed from the mainland to voters from many localities on the mainland temporarily residing or visiting in Honolulu. In addition, oaths of department heads and members of boards and commissions are sworn to before the Clerk or his deputies, and these are filed in this office. This office is also called upon continuously to furnish certified copies of Ordinances, Resolutions, Reports, etc., for use as evidence in court cases, in connection with the floating of bond issues, and for other purposes.

As of January 1, 1952, this Department had eighteen permanent employees, and 1 vacancy, making a total of 19 permanent positions. Eighteen temporary election clerks were employed for varying periods during the year to assist in registration and election work. In addition, 91 deputy registrars were commissioned to assist in the registration of voters, these deputies serving on a volunteer basis, without pay. In December 1952, two temporary positions were made permanent by the Board of Supervisors, and assigned to assist in the Printing Division, and authority was further granted by the Board to carry over two temporary election clerks for a period of six months, to assist in completing election records, so that, as of December 31, 1952, the personnel of this department was composed of 21 permanent employees, and 2 temporary employees. On May 7, 1952, John S. Gouveia, Supervising Machine Operator, who had been a loyal and faithful employee in the department for more than eighteen years, passed away, and his position was filled by Miss Gertrude K. Makini, by way of promotion.

II. REGISTRATION OF VOTERS: ELECTIONS:

PRIMARY AND GENERAL ELECTIONS - 1952:

At the General Election of 1950, the total number of registered electors was 93,353. The number of votes cast was 76,236, being 81.66% of the total registered vote. Following the 1950 General Election, 17,117 names were removed from the Great Register for failure to vote, and 247 names were removed because of death or conviction of felony, a total of 17,364. During the year 1951, 330 new electors were registered, leaving as of December 31, 1951, a total number of eligible voters of 76,319.

At the Primary Election held on Saturday, October 4, 1952, the total number of registered electors, viz., 76,319, was increased by the registration of new voters and reinstatements of former voters, to a total of 89,336. The total number of votes cast at the Primary was 62,946, a percentage of 70.46%.

For the General Election, held November 4, 1952, new registrations and reinstatements totaled 10,404, bringing the total registration in the City and County of Honolulu to an all-time high of 99,740, just 240 short of the total predicted in my annual report for 1951, wherein I estimated that the total registration would reach 100,000. The 1952 General Election also established an all-time high record in percentage of votes cast, to wit, 87.49%. This very high percentage of votes cast was undoubtedly due, in part, to the tremendous interest displayed throughout the entire United States in the National Election for President of the United States. However, I venture to state that the percentage of 87.49% for the City and County of Honolulu, and the percentage of 87.654 for the entire Territory, is among the highest, if not the highest, of any State or Territory of the Union.

The tabulation of votes cast showed that the following persons were elected to office in the City and County of Honolulu:

Two of the officers named above, to wit, Leon K. Sterling, Sr., Clerk, and Duke P. Kahanamoku, Sheriff, were unopposed, and were elected in the Primary Election, and their names were therefore omitted from the ballot for the General Election.

In the office of Treasurer of the City and County of Honolulu, the vote was extremely close, the incumbent Treasurer, Lawrence S. Goto, receiving a total of 104 votes over his opponent, Herman G. P. Lemke, Democrat. Because of the closeness of the vote, and also because of seeming discrepancies in the returns from several precincts, Mr. Lemke filed in the Supreme Court of the Territory a Petition for a Recount of the votes cast for this office. On December 8, 1952, the City and County Clerk was ordered to appear before the Supreme Court and to bring with him the bags containing ballots of several precincts, and to also bring with him a sufficient number of personnel to count the ballots. The bags of several precincts were opened and counted, with the result that the lead of Mr. Goto was appreciably increased, and on Friday, December 12, 1952, the attorneys for the Petitioner, Mr. Lemke, filed a discontinuance of the case, conceding the election of Mr. Goto as Treasurer of the City and County of Honolulu.

This election contest demonstrated the fact that many glaring errors were made by Election Inspectors in tallying the votes, and emphasizes the need for a program of education for at least the Chairmen of the Election Inspectors of the precincts. It further demonstrates the advisability of installing voting machines in all precincts as soon as possible, which would eliminate errors in tabulation, and would result in early and correct returns.

On December 11 and 12, 1952, a conference of all County Clerks with the office of the Secretary of Hawaii was held in Honolulu. Matters pertaining to the conduct of elections, and proposed amendments to the election laws were discussed, and the following recommendations were adopted:

Amendments to existing laws:

- a. Change the date of primary elections to the first Saturday in September, instead of the first Saturday in October, and change the closing date for registration to correspond.
- b. Amend Sec. 181, Revised Laws 1945 re change of residence, to remove conflict with Section 60 of the Organic Act.
- c. Reduce voting age to 20 years.
- d. Provide for the sending of absentee ballots to mainland or to another Island.
- e. Prohibit the taking of ballots out of election booths by either a voter or inspector.
- f. Where there is more than one unit in a precinct, provide a Chairman for each unit, in addition to inspectors.
- g. Prohibit candidates for elective office from serving as Election Inspectors.
- h. That the names of substitute candidates be submitted to the County

Clerk or Secretary of Hawaii, as the case may be, within five days after the withdrawal of a candidate, except when such withdrawal is due to death, or illness certified to by a physician.

- i. Provide that in addition to the Record of Proceedings, Roster of Voters and printed precinct list of electors, the tally sheet shall be delivered to the County Clerks, and not placed in the election bags, and that in any discrepancy between the sheet containing the results of votes cast and the tally sheet, that the tally sheet shall control.
- j. That the hour of closing of registration and filing of nomination papers be changed from midnight to the hour of closing of business, to wit, 4:30 p.m., that nomination fees be raised from \$10.00 to \$25.00, and in no case shall nomination fees be returned to a candidate.
- k. To provide for absentee voting in outside counties, before one deputized by the county clerk, in addition to before district magistrates; and also to provide for absentee voting by sending ballots to other districts, islands and to the mainland.
- l. To clarify the law re closed primary with regard to crossing the line when more than one class of candidates is included in one ballot.

Recommendations as to the administration of election laws:

- a. That metal ballot boxes be used, of a collapsible type, the size, etc., to be left to the discretion of the Secretary of Hawaii.
- b. That wherever possible, the Governor shall create additional units in precincts, so that no precinct will have more than 500 voters in each unit.
- c. That ballots be folded not more than twice.
- d. That Parole Boards be required to advise the respective county clerks of persons who have been pardoned by the Governor and who have had their civil rights restored.
- e. That all applicants for registration be required to give the exact date of birth, and not be allowed to state "over 21 years".
- f. That in counting the ballots, the order of counting shall be as provided in Section 235, Revised Laws 1945.

The Judges of Election for the Fourth and Fifth Representative Districts, appointed by the Governor, consisting of Abel R. Mattos, Chairman, Harry J. Auld and Harold Y. Shito, Members, sat for seven days prior to the Primary Election and for fifteen days prior to the General Election, in this office,

to consider complaints and appeals relative to the registration of voters. Only one case involving the challenging of the right of a voter to vote in the precinct in which he was registered and to act as an Inspector of Elections, was heard, and the Board, after hearing evidence, ruled that the voter did not legally reside in the precinct in which he was registered, and removed his name from the list of eligible voters, and also held that he was not eligible to act as an Inspector of Election in the 31st Precinct of the Fifth Representative District. All other cases heard and decided by the Judges of Election involved errors of omission of names from precinct lists and cases in which voters had moved to other districts, and their names had not been stricken.

SCHOOL BOND REFERENDUM:

Ordinance No. 1304, approved September 2, 1952, authorized the City and County of Honolulu, upon approval by the Congress of the United States of a bill to that effect, to issue bonds in a sum not to exceed ten million dollars for the purpose of the acquisition of real property for public school purposes, and for construction and replacement of buildings for public school purposes, as provided by Chapter 117, Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945, as amended, with the proviso that no such bonds shall be issued until at least sixty-five per centum of the registered voters of the City and County of Honolulu, voting at an election on the question of the issuance of such bonds, shall vote affirmatively on such question. The Ordinance further provided for an election on this question, such election to be held on November 4, 1952, the same day as the City and County General Election.

Special ballots were prepared, a campaign of information was conducted, an appropriation of \$8,750.00 was provided by the Board of Supervisors for the expenses of advertising, printing and personal services, and the election was held on Tuesday, November 4, 1952, with the following results:

There was some question as to the manner of determining the sixty-five percent necessary for the issuance of the bonds, and whether rejected and blank ballots should be considered in arriving at the required percentage, but based upon an opinion rendered by Deputy City and County Attorney R. A. Vitousek on November 5, 1950, on a similar election, holding that "ballots rejected or unintelligible or illegal should not be counted in determining the total vote cast upon a proposition to issue bonds, under a statute requiring the adoption by a three-fifths vote of the qualified voters of the town or city voting at the election", and also based upon the great weight of legal authorities on the subject, this office reached the conclusion that the 56,597 votes cast in favor of the bond issue constituted a percentage of 72.39, substantially in excess of the required sixty-five per cent. Consequently, on November 25, 1952, I reported to the Mayor and Board

of Supervisors that the referendum carried by a percentage of 72.39, and on that same day, to wit, November 25, 1952, the Board of Supervisors adopted a Resolution (No. 751) requesting the Congress of the United States to enact legislation authorizing the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of Honolulu to issue bonds for the purpose of acquisition of real property for public school purposes and for construction and replacement of buildings for public school purposes in the City and County of Honolulu, which Resolution was approved by the Mayor on November 26, 1952, and forwarded to the Congress of the United States.

VOLUNTEER DEPUTY REGISTRARS:

In addition to eighteen temporary election clerks provided for by the Budget, 91 Deputy Registrars were commissioned by me, to serve without pay, during the registration period. These Registrars were of great assistance to this office in all districts of the Island of Oahu, and were instrumental in bringing in many hundreds of registrations. Two groups of clerks from the paid staff were stationed at fixed points - one in front of the Bank of Hawaii in downtown Honolulu, and the other at the store of Sears Roebuck & Company, and thousands of voters registered with these two groups.

III PENSION ADMINISTRATION

(a) PENSION FUND FOR POLICEMEN, FIREMEN AND BANDSMEN
(Part 1, Chapter 121, R. L. 1945, as amended.)

This Pension System was created by Act 220, Session Laws of 1917, with the Board of Trustees consisting of the Mayor, Treasurer and Auditor of the City and County, ex officio, and with the City and County Clerk as ex officio Secretary of the Board. In 1939 the law was amended to provide for a Board of Trustees of three citizens, with terms of four years. The City and County Clerk is still ex officio Secretary of the Board of Trustees, and all administrative and clerical work is handled by his office, and all records are filed there. The present trustees are:

Seven meetings of the Board were held during 1952, after publication of notice as required by law.

As of December 31, 1951, there were 222 persons receiving pensions and allowances under this system, which includes all policemen, firemen and bandsmen who were employed on or before December 31, 1927, and their widows and minor children under sixteen years of age. Beginning January 1, 1928 all policemen, firemen and bandsmen automatically became members of the Employees' Retirement System. This trust fund will continue until all eligible policemen, firemen and bandsmen pass away. On December 31, 1951, there were still eligible for membership, 12 policemen, 35 firemen and 6 bandsmen. During the year three of these passed away, so that there are now eligible for membership 12 policemen, 32 firemen and 6 bandsmen, a total of 50. A list of these persons is attached to this report, on page 39.

During the year 1952, 5 police officers, 6 firemen, 1 bandsman and seven widows passed away, and three minor children reached the age of 16 years thus terminating their pensions and allowances. New pensions were granted to 8 widows and 9 minor children, so that as of December 31, 1952 there were 217 persons receiving pensions and allowances, under this system.

For the payment of pensions and allowances, a total appropriation of \$250,000.00 was provided by the Budget. Of this sum approximately \$237,570.00 was expended for pensions, and \$1000.00 was transferred to Current Expenses, Account B-15, to cover funeral expense payments, for 12 pensioners and 3 firemen still in service, for which only \$500.00 had been provided by the Budget.

It is my belief that this Pension System has already reached its peak, and that payments on account of pensions and allowances will from now on progressively decrease. For the year 1953, my budget request for the payment of pensions has been decreased from \$250,000.00 allowed in 1951, to \$240,000.00.

Following is a schedule showing the list of pensioners under this system, showing the names, effective dates and amounts, and the reasons why such pensions were granted.

III (b) CITY AND COUNTY PENSION SYSTEM:

The City and County Pension Board, consisting of five members, appointed by the Mayor with the approval of the Board of Supervisors for terms of five years, has supervision over all pensions granted to employees of the City and County and its predecessor, the County of Oahu, who are not members of the Employees' Retirement System, The present members are:

The City and County Clerk is ex officio Secretary of this Pension Board, and all administrative and clerical work is done in his office.

This Board is authorized to grant pensions to employees of the City and County who have a minimum of ten years of service and who are ineligible for membership in the Employees Retirement System of the Territory, and to widows of such employees. Pensions are granted upon the employee attaining the age of sixty years, or for physical disability. With very few exceptions, pensions under this system do not exceed the minimum of \$30.00 per month, and to this is added the cost of living bonus of \$25.00. Act 247 of the Session Laws of 1951 provided for the continuation of the bonus to pensioners until June 30, 1953.

As of December 31, 1951, there were 110 persons receiving pensions under this system. During the year new pensions were granted to 11 applicants, and 5 pensioners passed away, so that as of December 31, 1952, there were 116 pensioners on the active list receiving pensions; three of these being paid by the Board of Water Supply and 113 by the City and County.

The majority of applicants under this system are old employees of the Road, Building, Garbage and other departments who were compelled after 1946 to join the Retirement System, and after a short period reached retirement age, with only two or three years' membership in the system. Under Act 264, Session Laws of 1945, as amended, these persons were permitted to withdraw as members of the Retirement System and make application under the City and County Pension System. By Act 65 of the Session Laws of Hawaii 1951, the time within which an employee may withdraw as a member of the Retirement System and make application for a pension under the City and County Pension System, was extended to June 30, 1953.

\$42,000.00 was provided in the annual budget for the payment of pensions, of which amount the sum of approximately \$41,315.00 was expended.

III (c) LEGISLATIVE PENSIONS

Mandated by Special Acts of the Legislature to
be paid by the City and County of Honolulu.

Pensions granted by special acts of the Legislature and mandated to be paid by the City and County of Honolulu, formerly handled in the office of the Mayor, have for the past five or six years been administered in the office of the City and County Clerk.

As of December 31, 1951, there were 63 persons receiving Legislative pensions payable by the City and County. The 1949 and 1951 Legislatures denied all pension requests, so that no new pensions have been granted since 1947. During the year 5 pensioners passed away, leaving, as of December 31, 1952, 58 legislative pensioners. These pensions are paid out of two separate funds - The General Fund, from which 33 pensions are paid, and the Road Fund, from which 25 pensions are paid.

For the payment of these pensions an appropriation of \$21,225 from the General Fund, and an appropriation of \$16,055.00 from the Road Fund was provided in the Budget. Expenditures for pensions under the General Fund amounted to approximately \$20,989.00, and under the Road Fund to approximately \$15,117.00, a total of \$36,106.00.

One of the reasons for the decrease in the number of legislative pensions is that the Territorial Retirement and Pension Commission, created by the Legislature of 1945, made an exhaustive study of all pension systems, and in connection with legislative pensions, made the following recommendation to the Legislature of 1947:

"That the granting of legislative pensions should be avoided whenever possible. The Commission does not recommend any change in the basis of financing these pensions, but suggests that at the time they are granted the legislature consider the amount of the reserve which would be needed to provide the pensions to be granted, in order that the full cost of the proposed benefit may be known."

For the year 1953, my budget includes a request for an appropriation of \$15,000 from the Road Fund and \$21,000 from the General Fund, a total of \$36,000.00 plus \$17,700.00 for the cost of living bonus.

Charles K. Notley appointed January 12, 1926 to succeed McClellan. Not confirmed.

Charles En Sue (D) appointed January 12, 1926 to succeed McClellan. Not confirmed.

Petrie resigned effective December 31, 1925. Resignation accepted January 4, 1926.

The Board, as of January 4, 1926, was composed of the following: Messrs. Ahia, Clark, Cunha, Effinger and Hollinger.

Jonah Kumalae (D) appointed February 18, 1926 to succeed McClellan.

Kim Ak Ching (D) appointed February 18, 1926 to succeed Petrie.

Question of confirmation taken to court by Attorney General William B. Lymer in Quo Warranto proceedings.

On April 6, 1926, Judge Charles F. Parsons ruled in part as follows:

"For reasons above set forth the conclusion is that the Mayor's appointments of Messrs. Kumalae and Ching were not legally confirmed or reconfirmed on March 2, 1926, their own vote having been without effect for that purpose. It is further held that the claimants above named are without authority to act as supervisors of the C&C of Honolulu. That judgment of ouster be issued as against each of the respondents in conformity with this decision."

Minutes of May 11, 1926 show where Effinger was re--confirmed and Clark not confirmed.

Board continued to end of term with Messrs. Ahia, Cunha, Effinger and Hollinger.
