

I. (a) CLERICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
RECORDING AND REPORTING:

The City and County Clerk is by law Ex Officio Secretary to the Board of Supervisors, and as such his office handles the huge volume of administrative work incident to the orderly and efficient operation of a legislative body of a city and county having a population of more than 335,000, and operating under an annual budget of approximately \$23,000,000.00.

In the one hundred and seventy-five years since 1778 when Captain Cook landed in Hawaii, these Islands have moved from the outermost fringe of civilization to the center, and the designation "Cross-Roads of the Pacific" has come to signify the emergence of Hawaii as a place of strategic importance, economically, politically and militarily. Honolulu, the capital city, and the seat of the city and county government, is now one of the important cities of the world, and will continue to grow in importance as the crossroads of travel between the Occident and Orient.

The present Mayor and Board of Supervisors, elected in November 1952 and inaugurated in January 1953; is the Twenty-first Board of Supervisors of the City and County of Honolulu, under City and County Government. From July 1, 1905 to January 4, 1909, county government prevailed, with a Chairman and seven members of the Board of Supervisors.

Communications, reports, petitions, etc., addressed to the Mayor and Board are received in this office, numbered and submitted to the Board for action. Comparatively few of these communications and petitions are acted upon immediately, the great majority being assigned to the appropriate committee of the Board for consideration and action. This entails the reading and digesting of the contents of each communication, etc. All communications received are acknowledged and the writers advised as to which committee they have been assigned to.

Following each weekly meeting of the Board, the section of this office assigned to "Clerical Assistance to the Board of Supervisors" is a beehive of industry, - communications, petitions, reports and resolutions are assigned numbers; communications are answered, complete agendas for the two committees of the Board - the Finance and Public Works Committees - are prepared for delivery to the members of the committees and departments, for use at the committee meetings on Fridays. Printed copies of committee reports and resolutions are prepared. Approximately forty sets of the agendas and fifty sets of Committee Reports and Resolutions, are prepared each week and delivered to the Mayor and Members of the Board and to the various departments. Individual copies

of reports and resolutions are transmitted to various departments, organizations and individuals, as ordered by the Board; documents are processed for approval of the Attorney, Controller, Bureau of Plans, etc., before being submitted to the Mayor and Clerk for execution, and after execution those requiring filing with the Commissioner of Public Lands are transmitted. This procedure is repeated each week and personnel assigned to this section are continuously working under pressure. One other item that might be mentioned is the amount of paper and equipment required to turn out this huge volume of work. During the year 1953 approximately 1300 reams of multigraph and ditto paper, and upwards of 160 boxes of multigraph mats and ditto master sheets were used, totaling 650,000 sheets of paper, and 16,000 mats. This office operates one Multigraph Duplicator and two Ditto Machines, which equipment is also used by other departments of the City and County, so that they are in constant operation.

All Bills introduced are received, numbered, and published, and after enactment by the Board and approval by the Mayor, are again numbered as Ordinances and republished as required by law, and reprints made for general distribution. Certain Resolutions of the Board, covering matters such as the final disposition of land, and the condemnation of land for public use, are also published through this office, as are also Resolutions of the City Planning Commission, upon approval by the Board.

Since 1933, a complete subject index, entailing the indexing and cross-indexing of every communication, petition, report, resolution, bill, ordinance or other miscellaneous document or matter on which action has been taken by the Board, has been prepared and is currently maintained, entailing a vast volume of careful and painstaking work. With this index, this office is able, efficiently and quickly, to furnish information required by the departments and by the general public, on matters acted upon by the Board. This index should be completed back to the inception of county government, in 1905, but this has not been possible with the present staff.

During 1953, 57 meetings of the Board were held, and 39 public hearings before the Board were held, on bills pending, on public improvements, rent control, etc.

251 Messages from the Mayor, 3130 Department Communications, 1254 Miscellaneous Communications and 84 Petitions, were received and acted upon, a total of 4719. 4431 Committee Reports (1433 Finance, 2983 Public Works, 3 Special and 12 Legislative) were presented and acted upon by the Board, and 882 Resolutions were presented and acted upon.

62 Bills, including 5 pending from 1953, were acted upon, of which 52 became Ordinances, 4 were tabled, and 6 are still pending. A list of these Bills and Ordinances is appended hereto, on pages 58-61a.

68 Resolutions and 25 Variance Permits granted by the City Planning Commission were filed in this office during the year, and approved by the Board. These are listed on pages 62-71.

Bids covering 85 public projects were opened in this office during 1953, and submitted to the Board for award of contract and approval of bond, involving the expenditure of public funds in the sum of approximately \$11,007,343.78. The largest contract awarded during the year was for the construction of the Kalihi Tunnel, totaling \$4,518,582.27. A list of these contracts, giving the project, the name of the contractor, and the amount of the contract, is appended to this report, on pages 91-96. In connection with public contracts, this office handles the issuance of plans and specifications covering the various projects to prospective bidders, involving the receiving and disbursing of cash amounting to several hundreds of thousands of dollars each year. A separate bank account is maintained, into which moneys received for plans and specifications are deposited, and from which upon return of such plans and specifications, reimbursements are made to contractors. A summary showing these receipts and disbursements is shown on page 97.

147 Master Plumbers' Bonds were received during the year, submitted to the Board for approval, and upon approval, filed with the City and County Treasurer as required by law.

497 documents, including deeds, leases, assignments, grants, easements, greements, licenses, releases, contracts, etc., were received, submitted to the Board for approval, and upon approval by the Board, by the City and County Attorney as to form, and by the Engineer's Department as to correctness of description and survey, and also by the Controller's Office as to the availability of funds, were processed through this Department in conformity with the direction of the Board of Supervisors.

After the outbreak of the Korean War, the Board of Supervisors adopted the policy of sending resolutions of condolence to the families of service men injured, missing and killed. The forms of these resolutions were prepared in this office, and since October 1950, and up to the time of the Truce, this year, approximately 1350 of these resolutions were prepared and transmitted.

I. (b) GENERAL INFORMATION: PERSONNEL: APPROPRIATIONS:

The office of the City and County Clerk is the clearing house for information of all types concerning the City and County. Mail for various departments is received and routed through this office. Inquiries are received from all parts of the mainland, requesting information, requesting copies of birth certificates, marriage licenses and copies of divorce decrees, and those requests are referred to the proper agencies of government for attention and reply. In addition, many hundreds of persons call at the counters of this office during the course of the year seeking information as to the various functions and departments of the City and County.

The sale and issuance of copies of the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1942, are handled in this office. During the year a total of 43 volumes was issued, 35 sold at \$5.00 each, and 8 issued to various governmental agencies without cost. Since the revision of 1942, which included Ordinance 941, 433 Ordinances have been enacted by the Boards of Supervisors, the last numbered ordinance being No. 1374. When copies are sold, reprints of all ordinances enacted since the revision are furnished to the purchasers, but this is most unsatisfactory. There now remain for distribution and sale, only 24 copies of the 1942 revision, which is an insufficient number for distribution and sale this year, and it is imperative that a new revision of City and County Ordinances be undertaken immediately.

Another duty of this office is the safekeeping of Oaths of Office of City Officials, which are usually sworn to before the Clerk or his Deputies. The Seal of the City and County of Honolulu is kept in this office and is used to seal all official documents. In addition, this office is called upon continuously to furnish certified copies of Ordinances, Resolutions, Reports, etc., for use as evidence in court cases, and for other purposes.

As of January 1, 1953, this Department had twenty permanent positions and two temporary positions. On June 30, 1953, Louis Woodd, Accounting Clerk, was retired on disability, and his position has not as yet been filled. Two temporary election clerks were carried over from 1952, and have been continuously employed through the year, to assist in bringing election work up to date.

II. REGISTRATION OF VOTERS: ELECTIONS:

No elections were held during 1953. During non-election years, the work of the division is carried on by one Administrative Officer and three assistants, and in addition two temporary clerks were continued over from 1952. The work of the Election division in non-election years is mainly concerned with checking election lists, and correcting election records, registering voters and performing related work. Approximately one full year is required to completely and accurately check precinct lists against precinct rosters, and thereafter correct the Great Register of the City and County, and bring election records up to date. It is a task requiring patience and perserverance, with much checking and rechecking.

Registrations for the General Election on November 4, 1952, totaled 99,740. Of this total 87,271 actually cast their ballots, a percentage of 87.49% for the City and County of Honolulu. The percentage for the entire Territory was slightly higher, to wit, 87.654%. 12,469 registered voters failed to vote.

Laws relating to elections enacted by the Legislature in the Regular Session of 1953 are as follows:

Act 180 - (H. B. 790): An Act amending Section 235 of the Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945, relating to the order of counting the ballots.

Changes the order of counting county ballots from mayor, supervisors, sheriff, treasurer, auditor, attorney and clerk to mayor or chairman, supervisors, attorney, auditor, clerk, sheriff and treasurer. Effective June 4, 1953.

Act 181 - (H. B. 867): An Act amending the Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945, by adding a new section thereto, relating to the definition of votes cast.

Defines "votes cast" as any ballots (including returned absentee ballots) presented by voters to election inspectors for deposit in ballot boxes regardless of whether they are blank or later rejected. Effective June 4, 1953.

Act 188 - (H. B. 792): An Act amending Section 197 of the Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945, as amended, relating to election clerks.

Permits governor to authorize the appointment of additional clerks in election precincts of more than 800 registered electors where no additional voting units have been established. Prohibits a

candidate for office from serving as a clerk in that election or, failing of nomination in a primary, from serving as a clerk in the subsequent general election. Effective June 5, 1953.

Act 207 - (H. B. 789): An Act amending Chapter 6, as amended, of the Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945 by adding thereto a new section relating to district magistrates in absentee voting.

Authorizes county clerk, when notified by a district magistrate that it will be inconvenient for him to perform absentee voting duties, to designate any registered voter or an employee of his office as a substitute for the magistrate. Effective June 8, 1953.

Act 233 - (H. B. 514): An Act to amend sections 241, 6226, 6227, 6229, 6230, 6565, 6566 and 6567 of the Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945, relating to original jurisdiction of circuit courts over election contests.

Grants original jurisdiction to circuit courts in election contests; assigns hearings on petitions challenging decisions of boards of election inspectors to circuit courts (formerly supreme court) and circuit courts to hear such petition "as soon as it reasonably may be heard". Decisions may be taken on appeal to supreme court within ten days. Requires presence of circuit court judge in all cases when sealed packets containing official election materials are to be opened (formerly, required the presence of a supreme court justice, and circuit court judge's presence sufficed only where erroneously included record to be extracted). Tally sheets not to be included in such sealed packets. Effective June 12, 1953.

Act 238 - (H. B. 791): An Act amending Chapter 6, as amended, of the Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945, by adding thereto a new section relating to tally sheets used in the elections.

Provides tally sheets used in counting election ballots are to be attached to the original copies of result of votes cast and tally sheet to control, if there is a difference between the result of votes cast and the tally sheet. Tally sheets to be sent to Secretary of Territory or county clerks, depending upon nature of the election. Effective June 12, 1953.

Act 275 - (S. B. 652):-- An Act to amend Act 318, Session Laws of Hawaii 1949, to provide for the use of voting machines in all Territorial, County and City and County elections, and making an appropriation therefor.

The McCarran Act, entitled "An Act to revise the laws relating to immigration, naturalization and nationality and for other purposes", passed by the Congress in June 1952, over the veto of the President, became effective 180 days after its final passage on June 27, 1952, to wit, December 27, 1952. It was introduced in the House of Representatives as H. R. 5678, 82nd Congress, Second Session, and upon final passage became Public Law 414.

Under this law, many thousands of aliens residing in the Territory of Hawaii are now eligible for citizenship. A good many have already been granted citizenship, and many more are now preparing themselves for citizenship. It is estimated that with this group, plus the normal registrations and reinstatements, the total number of registered electors will reach a total of approximately 125,000 at the 1954 General Election.

New subdivisions created during the past few years, and several now under construction, will tend to shift the population of Honolulu. New subdivisions in Kailua, the opening of new farm lots and houselots in Waimanalo, the large expansion in building in Aina Haina and Niu, the huge housing projects in Aliamanu, and the Red Hill and Salt Lake areas, may necessitate the creation of new precincts or the redistricting of old precincts, for the convenience of residents in those areas. The matter of redistricting precincts, as well as renumbering them, will be called to the attention of the Secretary of Hawaii.

The total number of registered electors as of December 31, 1952, was 87,271. Adding new registrations and reinstatements through the year brings this total to 87,575; then deducting 362 voters who died during the year, and 86 voters who were convicted of felonies, leaves a total number of registered electors as of December 31, 1953, of 87,127.

A summary showing the above and also a summary showing the registered vote, the number of votes cast, and the percentages of votes cast from the 1946 elections to the present, follows:

III. PENSION ADMINISTRATION

(a) PENSION FUND FOR POLICEMEN, FIREMEN AND BANDSMEN (Part I, Chapter 121, R.L. 1945, as amended.)

The Pension Fund for policemen, firemen and bandmen was created by Act 220, Session Laws of 1917, with the Board of Trustees consisting of the Mayor, Treasurer and Auditor of the City and County, ex officio, and with the City and County Clerk as ex officio Secretary of the Board. In 1939 the law was amended to provide for a Board of Trustees of three citizens, with terms of four years. The City and County Clerk is still ex officio Secretary of the Board of Trustees, and all administrative and clerical work is handled by his office, and all records are filed there. The present trustees are:

Five meetings of the Board of Trustees were held during 1953, following publication of notice as required by law.

As of December 31, 1952, there were 215 persons receiving pensions and allowances under this system, which includes all policemen, firemen and bandmen who were employed on or before December 31, 1927, and their widows and minor children under sixteen years of age. Beginning January 1, 1928, all policemen, firemen and bandmen automatically became members of the Employees' Retirement System, and are not eligible for benefits under the old system. This trust fund will continue until all eligible policemen, firemen and bandmen pass away. On December 31, 1953, there were still eligible for benefits under this Trust Fund, 13 policemen, 28 firemen and 5 bandmen, a total of 46. A list of these persons is attached to this report, on page 38.

During the year 1953, 2 police officers passed away, and five minor children reached the age of 16 years thus terminating their pensions and allowances. New pensions were granted to 4 firemen, 1 bandman and one widow, and one minor child, so that as of December 31, 1953, there were 215 persons receiving pensions and allowances under this system.

For the payment of pensions and allowances, a total appropriation of \$240,000.00 was provided by the Budget. Of this sum approximately \$237,289.00 was expended for the payment of pensions and allowances, and \$2,500.00 was transferred to the Pension Fund of the

City and County Pensions, to cover a deficit in that account.

The 1953 Legislature passed the following Bills affecting pensions:

Act 3 - (H. B. 401) - An Act making supplementary appropriations out of the general revenues to cover certain deficiencies in territorial departments for the biennial period ending June 30, 1953.

Making deficiency appropriations for various departments, and for bonuses for pensioners under Act 247 of 1951. Effective April 16, 1953.

Act 168 - (H. B. 729) - An Act relating to deductions and exemptions for income tax purposes, amending sections 5 and 5508 of the Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945.

Exempts from net income tax compensation received in the form of a pension for past services, and no longer permits a person voluntarily paying another's taxes of impositions levied by a Hawaii jurisdiction or the U. S. to claim a net income tax deduction. Applicable to income taxes due January 1, 1954 or for a taxable year beginning in 1953, and thereafter.

Act 149 - (H. B. 626) - An Act amending paragraph 2 of Section 6173 of Chapter 121 of the Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945, as amended, relating to pensions for policemen, firemen and bandsmen.

Reduces to 5 years (formerly, 10) the period of service immediately prior to retirement to be considered in determining the average monthly compensation in computing the pension allowance of policemen, firemen and bandsmen. In determining pensions for those with more than 25 years service, increases percentage of average monthly compensation to 50 per cent plus 2 per cent for each year over 25, up to a maximum of 75 per cent (rather than a flat 50 per cent, as formerly; pensioners with 25 years service or less remain unchanged). Effective May 29, 1953.

Act 204 - (S. B. 409) - An Act relating to legislative pensions and providing for the transfer of the administration thereof from the Auditor to the Employees' Retirement System.

Transfers administration of 10 legislative pensions from the auditor to the employees' retirement system; appropriations for payments in biennial appropriations bill to be transferred accordingly. Effective June 5, 1953. Note - does not affect legislative pensions payable by city and county and counties.

Act 278 - (H. B. 1188) - An Act relating to the public service in the Territory and the several counties, including classification and compensation, vacations and sick leaves, holidays, vacancies in office, and pensions; and making appropriations related thereto.

In addition to other things, - continues the \$25 bonus for pensioners unless the pension is less than \$100, and adds up to \$10 monthly, as necessary, to bring the total pension to a maximum of \$100. Makes an appropriation of \$1,620,000 to pay these pensions.

This pension system has reached its peak, and payments on account of pensions will progressively decrease.

Following is a schedule of pensioners under this system, giving the names, effective dates and amounts of pensions, the number of years of service and the reasons why such pensions were granted.

III (b) CITY AND COUNTY PENSION SYSTEM:

The City and County Pension Board, consisting of five members appointed by the Mayor with the approval of the Board of Supervisors for terms of five years, has supervision over all pensions granted to employees of the City and County and its predecessor, the County of Oahu, who are not members of the Employees' Retirement System. The present members are

The City and County Clerk is ex officio Secretary of this Pension Board, and all administrative and clerical work is done in his office.

This Board is authorized to grant pensions to employees of the City and County who have a minimum of ten years of service and who are ineligible for membership in the Employees' Retirement System of the Territory, and to widows of such employees. Pensions are granted upon the employee attaining the age of sixty years, or for physical disability. With very few exceptions, pensions under this system do not exceed the minimum of \$30.00 per month, and to this is added the cost of living bonus, which, under Act 278, Session Laws of 1953, was increased from \$25.00 to \$35.00 on minimum pensions, and increased by not more than ten dollars in cases where pensions totaled under \$100.00 a month.

As of December 31, 1952, there were 116 persons receiving pensions under this system. During the year new pensions were granted to 13 applicants, and 8 pensioners passed away, so that as of December 31, 1953, there were 121 pensioners on the active list receiving pensions; three of these being paid by the Board of Water Supply and 118 by the City and County.

The majority of applicants under this system are old employees of the road, building, garbage and other departments who were compelled after 1946 to join the Retirement System, and after a short period reached retirement age, with only two or three years' membership in the system. Under Act 264, Session Laws of 1945, as amended, these persons were permitted to withdraw as members of the Retirement System and make application under the City and County Pension System. However, the 1953 Legislature did not extend the period in which applicants for pensions might withdraw from the Retirement System, so that no new pensions may be granted under Act 264.

\$42,000.00 was provided in the annual budget for the payment of pensions. However, this sum was entirely depleted, and an additional appropriation, by way of transfer, of \$2,500.00 was necessary. Expenditures under this system amounted to approximately \$44,045.00.

III (c) LEGISLATIVE PENSIONS:

Mandated by Special Acts of the Legislature to be paid
by the City and County of Honolulu:

Pensions granted by special acts of the Legislature and mandated to be paid by the City and County of Honolulu, formerly handled in the office of the Mayor, have for the past several years been administered in the office of the City and County Clerk.

As of December 31, 1951, there were 58 persons receiving legislative pensions payable by the City and County of Honolulu. The 1949, 1951 and 1953 legislatures denied all pension requests, so that no new pensions have been granted since 1947. During the year 5 pensioners passed away, leaving, as of December 31, 1953, 53 legislative pensioners. These pensions are paid out of two separate funds, - the General Fund, from which 30 pensions are paid, and the Road Fund, from which 23 pensions are paid.

For the payment of these pensions, an appropriation of \$21,000.00 from the General Fund, and an appropriation of \$15,000.00 from the Road Fund was provided in the Budget. Expenditures for pensions under the General Fund amounted to approximately \$20,300.00 and under the Road Fund to approximately \$13,700.00, a total of approximately \$34,000.00. As in the other pension systems, the 1953 Legislature increased the bonus on pensions under \$100.00 per month, under Act 278.

By Act 204, Session Laws of 1953, the administration of legislative pensions payable by the Territory was transferred from the Auditor of the Territory to the Employees' Retirement System. However, this does not affect the administration of legislative pensions under the City and County.

For the year 1953, my budget includes a request for an appropriation of \$13,500 from the Road Fund and \$20,000.00 from the General Fund, a total of \$33,500.00, plus \$21,500.00 for the cost of living bonus.
