MINUTES OF JANUARY 25, 2018

**FOR ACTION**

1. **RESOLUTION 18-22 – COUNCIL’S APPOINTEES TO SERVE ON THE RATE COMMISSION.** Appointing James Burke to the Rate Commission for an initial four-year term. (Committee deferred action on 1/25/18)
2. **RESOLUTION 18-38 – ESTABLISHING A PERMITTED INTERACTION GROUP TO MEET WITH FEDERAL OFFICIALS.** Establishing a permitted interaction group composed of Council Chair Ron Menor, Council Vice-Chair Ikaika Anderson and Councilmember Brandon Elefante to investigate issues relating to the Federal Transit Administration’s review and approval of the September 15, 2017 Recovery Plan.
3. **BILL 111 (2017) – RELATING TO BICYCLE PATHS.** Amending the ordinances relating to bicycle paths, including authorizing closure hours for bicycle paths. (Bill passed first reading 1/31/18)

**PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 111 (2017)** (Submitted by Councilmember Elefante) – The CD1 (OCS2018-0163/2/8/2018 3:27 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. Deletes the proposed amendment to ROH Section 15-18.10(c) that would prohibit fishing within all City bicycle paths and their easements. Instead, adds a new subsection (b) prohibiting fishing from any area within the limits of the Pearl Harbor Bike Path and its easement. Places the existing text of Section 15-18.10 into a new subsection (a) and renumbers the enumerated prohibitions accordingly.
- B. Amends proposed new Section 15-18.10(a)(22) to: (1) change the times a person may not enter or remain on a bicycle path from "night hours" to those times indicated on signs posted on the bike path; and (2) add an exception to the prohibition for persons entering or remaining on bicycle paths during closure hours who are traversing the path for the purpose of going to, or from, the shoreline. The as-introduced version only provides an exception for persons going to the shoreline.

- C. Adds a new SECTION 3 to the bill to conform cross-references to the affected provisions of Section 15-18.10. Renumbers subsequent bill sections accordingly.
  - D. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
4. **BILL 112 (2017) – RELATING TO MOPEDS.** Clarifying that mopeds are “vehicles” for the purposes of the City Traffic Code, including but not limited to the provisions governing the removal, towing, and disposal of abandoned or unsafely or illegally parked vehicles. (Bill passed first reading 1/31/18)
5. **RESOLUTION 17-328 – WORKFORCE STUDY.** Requesting the City Administration, Oahu Transit Services, Inc., and the Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation to conduct a workforce study to assess the staffing requirements for the City’s entire multimodal transportation system. (Budget deferred action on 11/15/17)

**PROPOSED CD1 TO RESOLUTION 17-328** (Submitted by Councilmember Elefante) – The CD1 (OCS2018-0164/2/8/2018 12:42 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. Changes the entities requested to perform and report on the workforce study from the City Administration, Oahu Transit Services, Inc., and the Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation ("HART") to the Department of Transportation Services ("DTS"), the Department of Human Resources ("DHR"), and HART.
- B. Changes the title of the resolution to reflect the entities requested to perform the workforce study.
- C. Modifies the third "be it resolved" clause to add that the workforce study consider current union agreements.
- D. Adds a "be it resolved" clause requesting that the DTS, DHR, and HART submit to the Council a written report of the results of the workforce study not later than November 30, 2018.
- E. Modifies the "be it finally resolved" clause to reflect distribution of the resolution to the Mayor, the Managing Director, the Director of Transportation Services, the Director of Human Resources, and the Executive Director and Chief Executive Officer of HART.
