“A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PUBLIC NUISANCES,”

introduced on January 25, 2018, and which passed first reading at the January 31, 2018, Council meeting, reports as follows:

The purpose of the Bill is to regulate nuisances on public sidewalks.

The Chief Engineer of the Department of Facility Maintenance testified in support of the intent, but noted concerns with the legal ramifications of the Bill.

A representative from the Honolulu Police Department testified in support of the Bill.

Your Committee received oral testimony from three (3) individuals in support, one (1) individual in opposition, and one (1) individual offering comments on the Bill. 
