MINUTES OF THE JUNE 27, 2018 REGULAR MEETING

FOR ACTION

1. **COMMUNICATION D-473 – OCEAN POINTE AREA IV C SUBDIVISION.** From the Department of Design and Construction requesting consideration of Deed conveying roadway Lots 18867, 18868 and 18869; Grant of Sewer Easements 10301, 10302, 10303 and 10315 for public use in Ewa.
2. **RESOLUTION 18-151 – GIFT FROM THE GALLO BUSINESS MEDIA (ENV).** Accepting a gift to the City from the Gallo Business Media for airfare, transportation, lodging, and meals for one employee to attend the Waste Haulers Summit in Scottsdale, Arizona, from October 17-19, 2018 valued at \$1,685.00. 3. **RESOLUTION 18-157 - GUIDANCE FOR USE OF THE BUILDING FIRE AND LIFE SAFETY EVALUATION WORKSHEET.** Urging the Honolulu Fire Department to hold its guidance for use of the building fire and life safety evaluation worksheet pending public review.
4. **BILL 51 (2018) – OBSTRUCTIONS ON PUBLIC SIDEWALKS.** Providing for the unobstructed traversing upon public sidewalks by pedestrians during the hours from 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., subject to certain exceptions. (Transmitted by Communication [MM-95](#); Bill passed first reading on 7/11/18)
5. **BILL 52 (2018) – ILLEGAL LODGING.** Continuing active communication regarding the shelter facilities available to those who would greatly benefit from these resource, offering to transport the individual to the shelter facilities, informing and encouraging those who would benefit from shelter facilities to make use of those resource. (Transmitted by Communication [MM-96](#); Bill passed first reading on 7/11/18)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 52 (2018) – (Submitted by Councilmember Fukunaga) – The CD1 (OCS2018—0700/7/18/2018 2:00 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. Adds a new subsection (d) providing that the proposed new article does not apply to any person engaging in an activity pursuant to a permit or license issued by the State, the City, or federal government.

- B. Adds a new SECTION 3 to the bill to provide that the ordinance would take effect upon its approval.
 - C. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments, including amendments to correct grammatical and typographical errors, improve clarity, and conform the bill to recommended drafting style.
6. **RESOLUTION 18-158 –THE ADMINISTRATION’S ACTION PLAN ADDRESSING THE PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY ISSUES ASSOCIATED WITH CONCENTRATIONS OF HOMELESS PERSONS IN THE CITY WHO MAY BE SUBJECT TO PROHIBITIONS AGAINST OBSTRUCTIONS ON PUBLIC SIDEWALKS OR ILLEGAL LODGING.** Requesting an update on the status of the City Administration’s action plan addressing the public health and safety issues associated with concentrations of homeless persons in the City and County of Honolulu who may be subject to prohibitions against obstructions on public sidewalks or illegal lodging.
