Madam Chair:

Your Committee on Budget, which considered Bill 73 (2018) entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PARKING METERS AT PUBLIC PARKS,"

transmitted by Departmental Communication 612 (2018) from the Department of Parks and Recreation, dated September 19, 2018, and which passed First Reading on October 3, 2018, reports as follows:

The purpose of Bill 73 (2018) is to establish parking meter charges and time limits at public parks.

At your Committee's meeting on January 23, 2019, the Director of Parks and Recreation ("Director") testified in strong support of the Bill, which would help ensure that parking spaces at public parks are affordable and available for park patrons. The Director stated the parking fee changes and time limits are consistent with current park rules. During the discussion, Councilmember Fukunaga asked the Director if the provision relating to the parking time limits at Kamamalu Neighborhood Park would impact YMCA's members and the City's partnership with YMCA. The Director responded that the changes would not affect YMCA's members and the City's partnership with YMCA.

Your Committee received no public testimony and no written testimony on the Bill.

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE

RELATING TO PARKING METERS AT PUBLIC PARKS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the People of the City and County of Honolulu:

SECTION 1. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish parking meter charges and time limits at public parks.

SECTION 2. Section 10-1.2, Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990 ("Park rules and regulations"), is amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:

- "(g) (1) Within the limits of any public park, it is unlawful for any person, where signs are posted prohibiting or restricting such activities, to operate, park or stand a motor vehicle in violation of such prohibitions or restrictions. Such signs may impose any prohibition or restriction upon the operation, parking or standing of motor vehicles which the director of parks and recreation shall determine will maximize the enjoyment and use of any park by park users. Such restrictions may include the installation of parking meters in parks.
- (2) Parking Meter Charges and Time Limits.
- (A) Meters at the Honolulu Zoo parking lot [~~shall~~] must have a four-hour time limit at the rate of [~~\$1.00~~] \$1.50 per hour.
- (B) Meters on the mauka side of Kalakaua Avenue between Monsarrat Avenue and the Paki Avenue-Poni Moi Road-Diamond Head Road intersection [~~shall~~] must have a four-hour time limit at the rate of 50 cents per hour and [~~shall~~] must be in effect between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m., seven days a week.
- (C) Meters at Kamamalu Neighborhood Park and 'A'ala Park must have a three-hour time limit at the rate of \$1.50 per hour.
- (3) Parking Meter Violations.
- (A) No person shall violate any provision of Section 15-22.11.
- (B) Every hour a vehicle remains parked, stopped, or standing in violation of any provision of Section 15-22.11 shall constitute a separate violation."

SECTION 3. Ordinance material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New ordinance material is underscored. When revising, compiling, or printing this ordinance for inclusion in the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu, the Revisor of Ordinances need not include the brackets, the material that has been bracketed and stricken, or the underscoring.

SECTION 4. This ordinance takes effect upon its approval.
