CITY AND COUNTY CLERK

FUNCTIONS

The functions of the Office of City and County Clerk may, in general, be placed in three categories, viz:

I. CLERICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE BOARD: RECORDING AND REPORTING:

The Clerk is by law the ex-officio Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and as such is required, among other things

- (a) To record all the proceedings of the Board;
- (b) To make full entries of all resolutions and decisions on all questions concerning the raising of money for and allowance of accounts against the City and County;
- (c) To record the vote of each member on any question on which there is a division or at the request of any member present;
- (d) To file and preserve all reports required to be made by the Board;
- (e) To prepare a complete Journal of all proceedings at each session of the Board, and at the end of each two-year term of said Board of Supervisors, to compile the same, and have the same bound in proper volumes;
- (f) To have custody of the official seal of the City and County of Honolulu;
- (g) To sign all leases, grants and conveyances of the City and County;
- (h) To receive and open bids on public works, and to submit all bids to the Board of Supervisors for action; with the Mayor to sign all contracts awarded by the Board of Supervisors and to keep in proper files, all contracts awarded and correspondence in connection therewith;
- (i) To preserve and keep on file all Ordinances enacted by the Board of Supervisors, and all Resolutions enacted by the City Planning Commission; to arrange for the publication of same and the distribution of printed copies thereof;

- (j) To administer the oath of office to all appointed officials;
- (k) To receive all communications addressed to the Mayor and Members of the Board of Supervisors; to submit same to the Board; to refer communications to various committees and departments as ordered; to preserve and file all communications.

II. REGISTRATION OF VOTERS: ELECTIONS:

In connection with the registration of voters and elections, the duties of the City and County Clerk are, among others:

- (a) To have custody and control of the General Register of Voters, and to keep the same open to the public at all times;
- (b) To examine electors of the City and County desiring to register as voters; to fill out the forms of "Affidavit on Application for Registration" and to administer the oath to all applicants;
- (c) To make transfers and changes in the Great Register as are necessary or requested from time to time;
- (d) To prepare and issue forms of nomination papers for elective offices; to receive all nomination papers from all candidates in primary elections and all city and county candidates in general elections;
- (e) To prepare, have printed, and distribute to the various precincts, election ballots and lists of voters;
- (f) To receive from election inspectors all election returns covering Territorial and City and County primary elections, and all returns of City and County general elections;
- (g) To tabulate the results of primary elections, both Territorial and City and County; and to tabulate the results of City and County General elections, and to issue certificates of election to those receiving the highest vote.

III. PENSION ADMINISTRATION:

The City and County Clerk, under Chapter 121, Revised Laws of Hawaii 1945, as amended, is ex-officio Secretary of two separate pension boards, viz:

(a) City and County Pension Board:

Created by Act 237, S.L. 1937; amended by Act 112, S.L. 1939; Act 59, Spec.S.L. 1941, Act 143, S. L. 1943 and Acts 175 and 264, S.L. 1945, and empowered to grant pensions to former employees of the City and County and widows of such employees who are ineligible for pensions under the Employees Retirement System;

(b) Board of Trustees of the Pension Fund for Policemen, Firemen and Bandsmen:

Created by S. L. 1917; amended by Session Laws 1923; 1927; 1929; 1931; 1933; 1939; 1941; 1943 and 1945, and empowered to grant pensions to former employees of the Police Department, Fire Department and Royal Hawaiian Band; to widows of deceased employees of said departments, and to grant allowances for the support of minor children until they reach the age of sixteen years; and also to authorize the payment of \$100.00 towards the funeral expenses of employees of said departments.

The administration of these two separate pension funds is handled entirely by the office of the City and County Clerk. Meetings of the Boards are called as the need arises; all clerical work, calculation of pensions and research work is done by the Clerk's Office, and the information submitted to the Boards upon which pension awards are made by the Boards.

1945 ACTIVITIES

With the termination of World War II -- E J-Day in Germany on May 8, 1945 and V-J-Day in Japan on September 2, 1945, there was inaugurated the era of reconversion, reorganization and reconstruction and the putting into effect of post-war planning, throughout the world.

Hawaii, which was a front-line of America during the war years, is faced with many problems. The City and County of Honolulu must put into operation as soon as possible, many improvements and projects much needed which of necessity were held up because of the war. Already this is reflected in increased activity in every department of the City and County, and as the office of the City and County Clerk is a clearinghouse through which flow the great mass of resolutions, reports, contracts, documents, communications, petitions, etc., from the Federal government, territorial government, from all of the city and county departments and agencies, civic and private organizations, and from the citizenry at large, -- to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors, the work of this department has materially increased.

I. CLERICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE BOARD:
RECORDING AND REPORTING:

During the year 1945, 56 meetings of the Board of Supervisors were held. 233 Messages from the Mayor, 1428 Departmental Communications 766 Miscellaneous Communications and 34 Petitions were received and acted upon. 2378 Committee Reports and 427 Resolutions were submitted and action taken thereon. 13 Bills were introduced, of which 12 were enacted into Ordinances and 1 tabled. 35 City Planning Commission Resolutions and 8 City Planning Commission Variance Permits were approved by the Board of Supervisors. 15 Contracts for public works were awarded during the year. 89 Master Plumber's Bonds were received, submitted to and approved by the Board of Supervisors. In addition to the above, this office acts as an information bureau for the City and County -- countless requests for information of various sorts from the departments and agencies of the government and from the public at large being handled during the course of the year.

A summary covering the past five years, showing the number and kinds of documents passing through this office is shown on page 14 of this report.

II. REGISTRATION OF VOTERS: ELECTIONS:

1945 is not an election year and therefore the rush of work incident to any election was not present. However, following the 1944 primary and general elections, there was a great deal of work to be done in checking and rechecking the general register of voters, eliminating the names of those on the list who failed to vote in the general election, and this work was done during the first months of this year.

I believe there is need for a re-registration of all voters of the City and County of Honolulu, as well as a re-districting of precinct boundaries in those precincts where the present total of registered voters is too high, and a renumbering of the precincts.

Re-registration - In 1927 and 1928 a complete re-registration of voters was had, and a visible card index system of registration was installed, which is still in use. However, since that time, modern improvements in registration systems have been inaugurated in many of the larger cities on the mainland, which Honolulu could well emulate.

Re-districting - A general survey of the boundaries of the present precincts should be made, and new precinct boundaries should be established so that the number of voters in each precinct might be more evenly divided and election inspectors in one precinct will not be called upon to do twice the amount of work that inspectors in another precinct are.

Renumbering - All of the precincts of the City and County of Honolulu should be renumbered, so that they will run consecutively from one boundary of the districts to the other, and not as they presently are, - for example in the Fourth District, the 30th precinct adjoins the 1st precinct.

However, any re-registration, re-districting or renumbering will have to be done by Act of the Legislature, and I would therefore recommend that you give this matter your serious attention, to the end that these matters may be brought to the attention of the next Legislature. Such changes as are above recommended will entail a great deal of work and a substantial outlay of money, but it will result in a much improved system of registration, a proper division of voters numerically and a less confusing method of numbering precincts.

A detailed statement relative to the registration of voters for the calendar year 1945 is made a part of this report, shown on page 21.

III. PENSION ADMINISTRATION:

(a) City and County Pension System:

The membership of the City and County Pension Board for the year 1945 consists of the following:

There are no set dates for meetings of the Commission, which are called by the Secretary as the need arises. During the year five meetings of the Board were held, - on January 25th; May 17th; June 14th; August 23rd and October 4th. A total of 14 pensions was granted during the year, 13 of which became effective in 1945, and one made retroactive to June 14, 1944. Five applications were denied, making a total of 19 pension cases handled. One pensioner passed away during the year. As of December 31, 1945, there were 32 persons receiving pensions under the City and County Pension Board.

During the year \$9,781.48 was paid out in pensions.

A list of the persons receiving pensions under this system, with the amounts of their pensions, is attached to this report, on pages 35 and 36.

(b) Board of Trustees of the Pension Fund
for Policemen, Firemen and Bandsmen:

The membership of the Board of Trustees of the Pension Fund for Policemen, Firemen and Bandsmen for the year 1945 consists of the following:

As is the case with the City and County Pension Board, meetings of the Trustees of the Pension Fund for Policemen, Firemen and Bandsmen are called by the Secretary from time to time as applications are filed. Under the law, meetings of this Board must be held after published notice. Six meetings were held during the year, viz: March 16th; May 17th; August 10th; September 28th; November 2nd and December 28th. The law governing this Board further provides that widows of deceased employees

of the Police and Fire Departments and the Royal Hawaiian Band may automatically, upon the death of their husbands, be granted pensions of \$50.00 per month for life or until remarriage, and also provides for the payment of \$100.00 towards the funeral expenses of any deceased employee. In addition, minor children of any deceased employee may be granted a monthly allowance of \$7.50 each until they reach the age of sixteen years.

During the year pensions were granted to 1 police officer, 4 firemen and 1 member of the Band. Four employees of the Police Department on pension died during this period. Two widows of police officers were granted \$50.00 pensions; one widow of a fireman and one widow of a policeman died during the year. Six minor children who had been granted allowances of \$7.50 per month reached the age of 16 during the year and their allowances thereupon ceased. In addition, 1 police officer, 4 firemen and 1 member of the band were granted pensions during 1945, but these pensions will not become effective until January 1946, and consequently these pensions are not included in the pensions listed in this report.

As of December 31, 1945, there were 82 police officers, 24 firemen and 8 bandsmen receiving pensions, a total of 114. In addition, 37 beneficiaries of police officers, 14 beneficiaries of firemen and 8 beneficiaries of bandsmen are receiving pensions, and 27 minor children are receiving monthly allowances of \$7.50 each.

Payments to pensioners, widows and other beneficiaries, and to minor children during the year totaled \$182,646.24. Expenses of administration of this pension fund, aside from pension payments, amounted to \$94.40.

A list of the pensioners under this system is attached to this report, shown on pages 22 to 36.

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The members of both of these Pension Boards are to be commended for the time and effort they have put into the work and for the conscientious and fair consideration given by them to all matters brought to their attention.
