

Dear Sir:

I have the honor to submit, herewith, a report of improvement plans accomplished by the City Planning Commission since I have been president, dating from August 10th, 1920. Before that time the City Planning Commission met very irregularly but it is now a well organized body and its members, who comprise some of Honolulu's most prominent business men, donate their time and serve the community very faithfully and unselfishly attending with great regularity the weekly meetings which are held every Thursday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock in the City Hall.

In order that the Commission may work intelligently, it became necessary to have the services of a paid secretary to look after the correspondence and detail work. To cover the salary of this secretary and other incidental expenses which have been necessarily incurred, the Board of Supervisors appropriated the following amounts, which are enumerated below:

Recommendations changing the present ordinance regarding the parking of automobiles in the business section of the City, has been submitted to the Board of Supervisors and the Zoning Ordinance, which has practically absorbed the entire time of the Commission since August 20th, 1920, is about to be submitted for final action. Minor matters such as recommending the widening

of certain streets, the rounding of corners for safety purposes, street widths and the handling of over-head wiring has been given time and consideration; as has also the question of street improvements and the laying out of street lines and the extension of certain streets and these matters will be gone into in greater detail in the near future.

Your president wishes to state that as a member of the City Planning Commission, previous to August 10, 1920, it was impossible for the Commission to complete any work owing to the lack of a secretary and also to the lack of an engineer to assist in their work. Since my appointment, August 10, 1920, with the present personnel of the Commission, the Board of Supervisors has allowed us a secretary, who has assisted materially in helping us complete what work we have done. We are greatly handicapped, however, by the lack of an engineer to aid us in the work we contemplate and which we cannot take up unless an engineer is given us. We understand that the City and County Engineer's Department is over-taxed and therefore cannot take up the work we would like to have done. It would help us materially if some arrangement could be made whereby we could have an engineer and we ask of you to use your efforts to secure one for us.

The Commission has extended a permanent invitation to the Outdoor Circle to attend any of the meetings which they think might be of benefit to their organization and Mrs. A. J. Campbell has been appointed as representative of the Outdoor Circle to serve in this capacity.

The Commission received some very helpful suggestions from Mr. Carpenter, member of the City Planning Commission of Johnstown, Pa., and Mr. Ralph Adams Cram, a prominent architect and President of the Planning Commission of Boston. These gentlemen visited our meetings while sojourning in our city.

The plans which we have for the future are very extensive and important and we hope, very shortly, to be able to present a definite program of our plans.
