MINUTES OF THE FEBRUARY 28, 2019, COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION MEETING.

FOR ACTION

1. **RESOLUTION 18-152 – TRANSPORTATION SAFETY EDUCATION OUTREACH PROGRAM AND MEDIA CAMPAIGN.** Urging the City Administration, through the Department of Transportation Services and the Honolulu Police Department, to implement a transportation safety education outreach program and media campaign addressing issues and conflicts among motorists, bicyclists, pedestrians, moped operators, and users of growing mobility marketplace options such as scooters and electric personal assistive mobility devices. (Committee amended to CD1 and postponed action on 9/20/18)

CD1 TO RESOLUTION 18-152 (Submitted by Councilmember Manahan) (Approved by the Committee at its September 20, 2018 meeting) – The CD1 (OCS2018-0907/9/20/2018 10:54 AM) makes the following amendments:

- A. Amends the title of the Resolution to add at its end “AND PROVIDE POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS.”
- B. Adds a ninth WHEREAS clause to read as follows:

WHEREAS, the State Department of Transportation recently reported that pedestrian fatalities in Hawaii have increased 525 percent this year when compared to the same time period last year, rising from four pedestrian deaths as of September 13th last year to twenty-five deaths as of the same date this year (*Pedestrian fatalities 525% higher than 2017*; KITV Channel 4; September 17, 2018); and

- C. Adds a tenth WHEREAS clause to read as follows:

WHEREAS, just as it has made infrastructure improvements for motor vehicles, bicycles, and other vehicles and devices, the City needs to ensure that pedestrian infrastructure improvements, facilities, and safety measures

are likewise prominently incorporated into Complete Streets and other transportation projects, especially given the introduction of mobility sharing alternatives already on the streets and sidewalks of Oahu; and"

D. Adds to the first BE IT RESOLVED clause a phrase urging the City Administration, through the Department of Transportation Services and the Honolulu Police Department, to "review existing policies, and provide recommendations of new policies, for enforcement and implementation of new mobility options."

E. Adds a new second BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED clause to read as follows:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Council of the City and County of Honolulu that the City Administration, through the Department of Transportation Services, is requested to review existing State and City laws and policies and provide its analysis of how those laws and policies will frame the enforcement and implementation of a growing mobility marketplace; and

F. Amends the third BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED clause to read as follows:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Administration report to the Council on the progress made in implementing the transportation safety education outreach program and media campaign, and on the City Administration's legal and review and recommendations, no later than November 30, 2018; and

G. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.

PROPOSED CD1 TO RESOLUTION 18-152 (Submitted by Councilmember Elefante) – The CD1 (OCS2019-0252/3/13/2019 7:56 AM) makes the following amendments:

A. Amends the title of the Resolution to add at its end "AND PROVIDE POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS."

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- B. Adds a ninth WHEREAS clause to read as follows:

WHEREAS, according to Hawaii State Department of Transportation, pedestrian fatalities in the City increased dramatically from 12 in 2017 to 27 in 2018, and six pedestrians died in traffic accidents in the City in the month of January 2019, including three killed at one time in a tragic incident in the central Honolulu neighborhood of Kakaako on January 28, 2019; and

- C. Adds a tenth WHEREAS clause to read as follows:

WHEREAS, just as it has made infrastructure improvements for motor vehicles, bicycles, and other vehicles and devices, the City needs to ensure that pedestrian infrastructure improvements, facilities, and safety measures are likewise prominently incorporated into Complete Streets and other transportation projects, especially given the introduction of mobility sharing alternatives already on the streets and sidewalks of Oahu; and

- D. Adds to the first BE IT RESOLVED clause a phrase urging the City Administration, through the Department of Transportation Services and the Honolulu Police Department, to "review existing policies, and provide recommendations of new policies, for enforcement and implementation of new mobility options."

- E. Adds a new third BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED clause to read as follows:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Council of the City and County of Honolulu that the City Administration, through the Department of Transportation Services, is requested to review existing State and City laws and policies and provide its analysis of how those laws and policies will frame the enforcement and implementation of a growing mobility marketplace; and

- F. Amends the last BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED clause to read as follows:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Administration report to the Council on the progress made in implementing the transportation safety education outreach program and media campaign, and on the City Administration's legal and policy review and recommendations, no later than six months after the date of adoption of this resolution; and

G. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.

2. **BILL 8 (2019) – RELATING TO PARADES AND ACTIVITIES ON STREETS.**
Limiting the number of parades and activities on certain streets and ensuring that parades and activities that require exclusive use of streets serve a public purpose.
(Bill passed first reading on March 8, 2019)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 8 (2019) (Submitted by Councilmember Formby) – The CD1 (OCS2019-0231/3/7/2019 4:28 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. Amends the new Revised Ordinances of Honolulu Section 15-24.20(e)(3) contemplated by the bill by exempting First Amendment parades and activities (as defined in the section) from the new “public purpose” post-parade or activity certification proposed by the bill which would be required within 30 days after a permitted parade or activity takes place.
- B. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
