Your Committee on Public Safety, to which was referred the following:

ACCEPTANCE OF GIFT TO THE HONOLULU EMERGENCY SERVICES DEPARTMENT FROM MR. WILLIAM J. NATHAN,

transmitted by Communication D-1076/03 from the Director, Honolulu Emergency Services Department, dated November 3, 2003, reports as follows:

The purpose of this communication is to recommend Council acceptance, on behalf of the City, of a donation of a postal money order in the amount of \$100.00 from Mr. William J. Nathan to be used by the Emergency Medical Services and the Ocean Safety and Lifeguard Services Divisions of the Honolulu Emergency Services Department.

Section 13-113 of the Revised Charter of the City and County of Honolulu provides as follows:

The council, on behalf of the city, may accept gifts or donations of money, securities or other personal property or of real estate or any interest in real estate.

To implement this Charter provision, the Council adopted Resolution 86-298, which establishes guidelines for the solicitation and receipt of gifts by executive agencies.


Your Committee finds that the acceptance of this gift is in conformity with the provisions of Resolution 86-298, in particular:

3. That the Administration has complied with the requirements of Resolution 86-298 that relate to the acceptance of gifts valued at less than \$1,000.

Your Committee further finds that this gift, if accepted, will benefit the people of the City and County of Honolulu.
