WHEREAS, the design of the mural was determined through a collaborative process with artist Luke DeKneef, students at Voyager Public Charter School, and older adults from Mō'ili'ili during an intergenerational community design workshop on October 17, 2019, with guidance from the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) Hawai'i, Blue Zones Project Hawai'i, and the Department of Parks and Recreation; and

WHEREAS, the description and value of the gift are set forth in the Declaration of Gift attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City and County of Honolulu that this body accepts the gift valued at \$15,000 from Kaho'omiki that is more fully described in the above-mentioned letter and the Declaration of Gift attached as Exhibit A; and


