PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AND TESTIMONY

VIEWING THE MEETING AND RESTRICTIONS ON ENTRY

No members of the public will be allowed into the hearings room, but may listen to the meeting on a live broadcast. All Commissioners will be participating in the meeting by interactive conference technology from remote locations.

While in Suite 111, all Social Distancing Requirements set forth in the Proclamation and the Emergency Order must be strictly observed.
