Your Committee on Public Safety, to which was referred the following:

ACCEPTANCE OF GIFT TO THE HONOLULU POLICE DEPARTMENT
FROM DRUG ABUSE RESISTANCE EDUCATION (D.A.R.E.) AMERICA,

transmitted by Communication D-1120 (2004), from the Chief of Police, Honolulu Police Department, dated November 26, 2004, reports as follows:

The purpose of this communication is to recommend Council acceptance, on behalf of the City, of a gift of airline tickets and funds for lodging and meals valued at \$945 from Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) America. This gift will be used by the Police Department's D.A.R.E. Coordinator to attend the D.A.R.E. National Joint Regional Training in San Antonio, Texas, from January 10 to 11, 2005.

Section 13-113 of the Revised Charter of the City and County of Honolulu provides as follows:

The council, on behalf of the city, may accept gifts or donations of money, securities or other personal property or of real estate or any interest in real estate.

To implement this Charter provision, the Council adopted Resolution 86-298, which establishes guidelines for the solicitation and receipt of gifts by executive agencies.

3. That the Administration has complied with the requirements of Resolution 86-298 that relate to the acceptance of gifts valued at more than \$1,000.

Your Committee further finds that this gift, if accepted, will benefit the people of the City and County of Honolulu.
