Dean Uchida is the Executive Director of the Land Use Research Foundation of Hawaii (LURF), which is a private, non-profit research and trade organization whose members are major Hawaii landowners and developers. He is a graduate of Pearl City High School and the University of Oregon. He also has obtained Master's degrees from both the University of Hawaii and the University of Southern California.

Mr. Uchida has been involved, from both the private and public sectors, in real estate development, property management, land use law and land use planning in Hawaii since 1981. He has over 20 years experience with the Department of Land and Natural Resources managing conservation zoned lands, development of water resources and the oversight of all state owned lands. He has also worked for a private planning/engineering firm focusing on infrastructure and land develop projects.
